Yellow Patch on Moreton Island is the destination and is a fascinating area of fresh water creeks and sandhils. Situated on the northern tip of the Island, Yellow Patch affords opportunity to visit the spectacular Cape Moreton with its 400 foot cliffs and century old lighthouse.
