Be aware of the well being of others. If a fellow member is not feeling well, be aware of it. It is rather frightening, particularly for a new member, if he or she is sick and a long way from the comfort of home. Even a kind word is a great help to someone in this position.

As sleep is rather important, but very elusive to some members, particularly on the Friday night of a weekend. All noise should cease at midnight and should not start again before six in the morning. (This, of course, could vary with the arrival time at a campsite and the scheduled departure time the next morning). We especially ask you to keep others in mind and so allow everyone to obtain sufficient sleep.

Lastly, share your company with others. Talk and walk with others. When you stop for a meal do not set yourself apart from the group. The Club needs your help, your co-operation and your personality to survive.....
