CAMPING HINTS:

Pitch tent in as sheltered a spot as possible, with opening away from prevailing wind. Not in a hollow that will be a watercourse in wet weather, and not under dead trees. Raising one side or "abduLLing" a tent makes more space and will reflect heat from a fire in cool weather. Don't leave a wet tent rolled up, spread to dry as soon as possible.

FIREPLACES.

Down wind from tent. If a spark is blown onto the tent, you will have little chance of avoiding a fire as they burn very quickly. Don't use stones from creek beds as they explode when heated.

For lighting fires during wet weather, dry wood can be obtained by splitting a log. Dead branches off the ground do not become water logged. A small piece of candle or canned heat will help. Always put a few dry sticks in tent, and be sure of a quick fire. Make sure fire is out before leaving.

SLEEPING.

One requires more underneath than on top. Bracken or dry grass makes a soft bed. Newspaper between ground-sheet and sleeping bag keeps ground cold from penetrating.

SANITATION: For the protection of your health and of others:

1. All refuse must be covered by soil.
2. Tins, burnt, bashed and buried. Papers skins etc. burnt.
3. The camping spot should be left exactly as it was found.
