MOTION TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF BRISBANE CATHOLIC BUSHWALKING CLUB.

Relevant Sections - Sections 7 (VI), 10 (II), 11 (I), 11 (V).

It is moved.....

- (I) (a) that the office of President-Chaplain be abolished.
- (b) that the office of President be created and that such office be elective.
- (c) that the Chaplain shall be an ex-officio member of the General Committee and every Sub-Committee of the Club.

(II) that by the moving of part (I) of this motion the relevant Sections of the Constitution are amended and added to as follow:-

Section 7(VI) - The Chaplain shall be, by virtue of his appointment by His Grace, the Archbishop of Brisbane, an Ordinary Member of the Club.

Section 10(II) - The Chaplain of the Club shall be a Trustee for the Club.

Section 11(I) - The General Committee shall consist of ten (10) members-

viz. President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Outings Secretary, Treasurer, Social Secretary and four other Ordinary Members - all of whom shall act in an honorary capacity, and all of whom shall normally be elected in the stated order at the Annual General Meeting.

Section 11(V) - The General Committee may at any time appoint such Sub-Committees as it deems necessary or expedient for the furtherance of the objects of the Club. Such Sub-Committees shall report to the General Committee and perform their duties under its supervision.

Section 11(VII)- The Chaplain, President and General Secretary shall be ex-officio members of every Sub-Committee of the Club.

The committee has moved the following amendment.

It is moved that the office of President-Chaplain be abolished by amending the constitution as follows-

Section 7(VI) - The Chaplain shall be, by virtue of his appointment by His Grace, the Archbishop of Brisbane, an Ordinary Member of the Club.

Section 10(II)- The Chaplain of the Club shall be a Trustee for the Club.

Section 11(I) - The General Committee shall consist of ten (10) elected members-
viz. President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Outings Secretary, Treasurer, Social Secretary and four other Ordinary Members - all of whom shall act in an honorary capacity, and all of whom shall be elected in

the stated order at the Annual General Meeting. The Chaplain shall be an ex-officio member of the General Committee.

Section 11(V) - The General Committee may at any time appoint such Sub-Committees as it deems necessary or expedient for the furtherance of the objects of the Club. Such Sub-Committees shall report to the General Committee and perform their duties under its supervision. The Chaplain, President and General Secretary shall be ex-officio members of every Sub-Committee of the Club.
