The National Parks of Springbrook carry some of the densest rain forest in the south eastern portion of the State and the many waterfalls are far famed. Whether you revel in the southern views from Bilborough Lookout, prefer the walk into and through the great Purlingbrook Falls, hanker for the scrub bashing along Lyre Bird Ridge overlooking Numinbah Valley, or wish to ascend the interesting Pinnacle which rises abruptly from Waree National Park, you will be well served.
