WEEKEND TRIP/ MOUNT GREVILLE & MT. MOON / MARCH 15/17, 1968.

Nominate immediately this circular is received and transport will leave Roma and Turbot Streets at 6.30 p.m. on Friday. These mountains are well known to the majority of buswalking enthusiasts. Situated immediately to the east of Cunningham's Gap, Mt. Moon is actually the higher of the pair although from the main highway, the towering cliffs of Mount Greville make this hard to believe. At the present time, there is an outstanding colour photograph of Mount Greville with Lake Moogerah in the foreground in the window of the Queensland Tourist Bureau. Between the two mountains flows Reynolds Creek which is a particularly beautiful stream traversing both rain forest and mountain country and, in the vicinity of the dam, agricultural and farming properties. Both Mount Greville and Mount Moon are approximately 2,800 feet high and both have been declared National Parks. Mount Greville is noted for its several gorges in which piccabeen palms grow profusely and also for the spires of rock on the northern side. Mt. Moon is approached via several smaller summits and the view from the main peak embraces every section of the compass. The scenery surrounding this camp site is particularly attractive and in fact this area was chosen for the very

first Club Camping trip in early 1958. It is a weekend not to be missed.

DAY WALK/ SUNDAY MARCH 24TH./ MOUNT SAMSON

It is quite some time since we have had an official club visit to Mr. Samson and this is indeed a pity for the newer members. Mt. Samson is one of the most striking peaks on the Brisbane skyline and its twin summited outline can be seen on most days to the north west of the city. It is approached via Samford and Closeburn and from its summit of 2262 feet, can be seen outstanding views of the D'Aguilar range, the Glass Houses and also the Coast Line as far as Caloundra should the day be unaffected by haze. Full water bottles are recommended for this trip as water is quite scarce on the summit and it is also suggested that all present make an effort to be punctual as the ascent of the mountain takes quite a long time.

It may be possible to have a swim in the creek in the late afternoon so come prepared for this purpose. The surrounding peaks are Mount Gobble 1260 feet to the north, Mt. D'Aguilar 2444 feet and Mt. Glorious 2050 feet to the west, and Mt. O'Reilly about 1600 feet to the south. Except for the small outline of clear mountain, there is a plain stretching away to the east of it is across this plain that outstanding views are obtained of Moreton Bay and Moreton and Stradbroke Is.
