MAY LONG WEEKEND - Bus Trip - Acacia Plateau - 28th April to 1st. May - Bus departs Greyhound Depot 6.30p.m. Friday 28th April. Nominations together with £2.10.0 are to be lodged with the club box by Thursday 20th April. LEADER - Jim Collins - Members are reminded that the Council elections are being held on 29th April and those eligible to vote (vive! Ma Pamhurst) should cast an absentee vote before leaving.

Although lasting three days members are advised that it will be possible to obtain provisions at times during the trip - so don't overburden yourself with food, especially perishables.
