The Mt. Barney Massif with both East and West Peaks approx. 4,450 ft. high, is considered by many to be the finest mountain structure in O'land, and it holds its own with the finest peaks in Tasmania. The Massif contains five peaks, East, West, North and Leaning Peak all over 4,000 ft. and Isolated Peak, which is connected to the great Eagle's Ridge which drops down in rugged line to the Lower Portals on Rocky Creek which flows down from Mt. Ballou.

The ascent will be up the Bushwalkers' Ridge to the University Hut, from where more energetic members may do either East Peak or West Peak.

The going on this ridge is not difficult, and there are fine views of Mt. Ernest and Mt. Lindesay which rises behind it on the way up.
