Precise details for this trip have not been finalised and full details will be given at the May meeting. However both walks will be most interesting and will give ample opportunity for the parties to explore the Wyberba area fully. The through-walk will start at Mt. Prentice and then walk via Boonoo Boonoo Falls down the river to Undercliffe Falls. Base Campers will camp at Boonoo

Boonoo Falls and from here will visit both the falls and Mt. Prentice. They will then travel by bus to Undercliffe Falls to pick up the through-walkers. After Mass in Stanthorpe, both parties will combine and on Monday will probably visit the Pyramids.

This trip will provide a good coverage of the spectacular scenery of the Wyberba Granite Belt. Boonoo Boonoo Falls are unique with their straight drop of 900 ft., and Undercliffe Falls have interesting formations of water-worn granite. Despite the magnificence of the Wyberba scenery the long distance from Brisbane allows the club to visit the area only once a year, so all members should keep this weekend free, particularly since this is the first occasion that the club has undertaken a through-walk in the Wyberba area. For those visiting Wyberba for the first time, don't forget a camera and plenty of warm clothing.
