THE TWEED PINMACLE BASE CAMP - JULY 7th/9th. Leader Jim Farrell.

Closing Date for Nominations - Thursday June 29th. Fare 30/-.

Departure point - Greyhound Bus Depot - Friday evening 6.30 pm.

The Tweed Pinnacle, 3014 ft, is situated on the Tweed Range which forms part of the Border Rim of the great Mt. Warning erosion cauldron and from this superb vantage point there are magnificent views of Mt. Warning and the Valley of the Tweed.

The campsite will be in the beautiful LIMPINWOOD VALLEY which is -immediately below Echo Foint (0'Reillys) and it will allow those who have so often gazed down on this country from the escarpments above to get to know it first-hand.

Tyramid Bock at O'Ceillys, is not difficult and will be well within the capabilities of all who go.

South of Nt. Warning, and in a clear line of sight from the Pinnacle, rises the great rugged mass of Blue Knob, to the left of Which is the Sitting Lion formation. Blue Knob rises to a height of just over 4000ft and originally the road from Murwullimbah to Nigbin (noted for its rugged peaks similar to those of the Glasshouse Group) used to run around its flanks until it was destroyed by an avalanche some years ago.

This trip is especially commended to members and it will open new country for them and relate to places already visited, such as, O'Reillys, Mt. Warning, The Cougals and Springbrook.

STINSON WRECK THROUGH WALK - JULY 28th/30th. Leader Vince O'Reilly.

Nominations £2.0.0 close Tuesday July -18th. Departure Point etc. to be

This walk will be through rugged country and prospective participants

are warned to keep their packs as light as possible. Water Bottles are essential. Friday Night the party will wilk 6 miles out to Boho Pt. to camp there, leaving early next morning to proceed along the Border Track to lunch at Rat-a-Tat (an old Forestry camp). Thence the way will be up over Mt. Throakban on to Pt. Lookout, the camp-site for Saturday Night. Along this stretch there are some excellent views down into N.S.W.

The Stinson Wreck will be examined on the Saturday afternoon, as the party will have to commence the descent into the Christmas Creek area early on Sinday morning. This will be along Lamington Plateau via the old Stretcher Track. Transport will be arranged to take the party from Christmas Creek back to Brisbane for Finday evening Mass.

N.E. A constant pace will have to be maintained on this walk to keep to the time-table.
