EDITORIAL.

You have received with your circular this month, a copy of the draft of the new club constitution which is submitted by the Committee for your perusal and modification where required. Since the redrafting of the constitution was accepted by the club two years ago, there has been a great deal of work and many tedious hours devoted to this end by both the special sub-committee and by the general committee.

It is hoped that the general members will show their appreciation of these efforts by a genuine and sincere interest in the contents of this document by which our activities as members of this club are governed. The new constitution was proposed in an effort to remove a number of seeming anomalies and since it is not intended to appoint a "Devils Advocate" it is up to the members themselves to ensure that their hopes for this new rule have been fulfilled. It is hoped also that the members will take a lively interest in the considerations of the different clauses at the July and subsequent meetings.

IN COMMITTEE.

The Committee is also investigating the purchase of a Club First-Aid kit for base camps. It is intended that this will contain sufficient requirements to cope with all but a major disaster. The trip will include the ascent of Mt. Huntley 4,175ft. and Mt. Asplenium 4,241ft. and also will visit Panorama Point which, according to a reliable authority, provides views which rank with the best obtainable on the whole scenic rim.

The area covered will be between the well known Spicers Gap and the Mt. Superbus/Mt. Roberts area which was covered by the club on a previous trip and is a must for those who hope to do their Scenic Rim in small stages.

Flinders Peak is one of the most outstanding mountains within day-walk range of Brisbane. It rises 2,247ft. and can be seen from almost any point of South East Queensland.

Geographically it is situated at the end of the Teviot Range about 45 road miles from Brisbane and dominates the Ipswich sky point. It is a few miles South West of Ipswich and a fine view of the township can be obtained from the top. The view from the top is almost 360 degrees and with Mt. Blaine, Mt. Goolman, Ivory Rocks and Mt. Needle dominating the foreground it is a most rewarding view. It is not a difficult ascent and can be recommended to all daywalkers, new members and visitors.

All those attending are advised to take full water bottles.
