EDITORLAL by P. Wijngaarden

On 18/19th, May, the Queensland Federation of Bushwalking Clubs held its first Track Clearing Weekend at Binna Burra. 29 People attended representing 5 member clubs, the largest contingents coming from N.P.A., Binna Burra Bushwalkers and ourselves. Some Clubs were not represented either because of prior arrangements, or on policy grounds.

On the Saturday, perhaps 2 miles of the old Bimboola Lookout graded track above Illenbah was cleared to about 2/3 of the way up to a point on a grassy ridge providing easy, direct access to the top. An alternative route is via a graded track running parallel to the river, ending in clear private property through which one would have to pass to gain the top via a ridge running approximately north/south. Accordingly, there appears little justification for supporting the tentative proposal to do more work on this track as the people in need of graded tracks are unlikely, as a rule, to take on this additional section as Illenbah, itself, is more than 6 miles from the Lodge. Sunday's work involved clearing an existing one mile blazed trail from Binna Burra to Split Rock, on the edge of the Coomera Gorge. This was quite a worthwhile task and more goodwill is likely to accrue to the Federation as a result, than from the work done on the Bimboola Lookout track, as it has considerably more potential for consistent use by the general public as well as bushwalkers. However, how is the public to know that the Federation did the good deed of re-opening the track?

There exists no unanimous support from member clubs for the idea of organised track clearing. Some clubs favour it strongly, most are less sure, and, at least one opposes the practice. The attitude taken depends on the weighting given to the factors involved which weighting, in turn, varies with inherent attitudes, partly based on age and environment.

Track clearing implies re-opening of existing tracks to places of interest, for the benefit of whoever should wish to go there, but, primarily, bushwalkers. However, this should not be interpreted to result in the wholesale opening up of a few of such tracks but, rather, to clear it to the extent necessary to provide a ressonably clear route to the destination sought.

Federation must ensure that the work of its volunteers does notencroach on work which is the responsibility of the Forestry Dept. or else risk losing their support. Perhaps some may argue this is not of great importance as work done, which might otherwise have been left to the full time Forestry staff, would enable them to work on other tracks to the benefit of all.

Some may look on track clearing as an exercise in conservation of our parks by providing clear tracks rather than having people making many individual routes resulting in a maze, as exists in the Lost World.

Others may argue that, if a track is little used, there may be no worthwhile object of interest as its end or, a more suitable route exists. The underlying premise here being that bushwalkers will keep open, through use, the tracks that they really want to.

Some fear that, by going out of its way clearing tracks, Federation will cause some of the challenge and appeal of bushwalking to be lost. This may have some validity who have habitually return from a trip very late and have no worry about having to turn up for work on time, but, while the number of track clearing weekends are limited and care is taken in choosing the tracks to be worked on, this fear is not likely to have much foundation.

The weekend at Binna Burra was quite an enjoyable one little different from doing a solid trip involving some scunge bashing.

Through this discussion, it is hoped that members will be able to form relatively informed opinions on the relative merits of the various arguments, and that they let their opinions be known at the General Meeting or to a Committee Member so that the club's attitude can be determined with knowledge of the general attitude of the members.

RO-D INSTRUCTIONS FOR MT. DOUBLE TOP OUTING

Take New England Highway, turning off to Yangan a little past the Warwick Caltex service station and just before the bridge over the Condamine River. Follow the road through Yangan te Swanfels reached after a right turn over Swan Creek, Continue along this road which has some stoney sections. The campsite is approx 2 miles past the junction with Hell Hole Creek.
