But is this really the spirit of Bushwalking which is surely unselfishness consideration for others and mateship? There is also the added annoyance that these people generally do not contribute one penny towards the cost of the trip. There is provision in the constitution for a charge of 5/- to be levied on each person, and this will be strictly adhered to.

It is also a rule of the club that all people nominating for a trip must forward their nomination fee with the nomination. This is not being done. The payment of the fee separate from the nomination makes additional work for the outings secretary and if members do not come who have nominated but not paid, the trips could run at a loss. In any case of a shortage of seats, those who have paid their nomination fee must receive preference.

With regard to outings, it should not be (but it appears to be) necessary to point out that all campsites and as far as possible the bus, should be left at least as tidy as they were found.

The party will camp at Tooloon Falls on the Friday night and Saturday night, climb South Obelisk on the Saturday and Edinburgh Castle will be climbed on the return journey on the Sunday.

This area immediately south of the border provides first class bushwalking country with outstanding views. Tooloon Falls (the campsite) is a miniature Niagara if there is good rain, and the Obelisks, rising Glass House Mountain like, from the surrounding plains, are worthy of a visit even without the added attractions.

Mount Edinburgh Castle itself appears as a large rounded lump and lies just to the south of the Mount Lindesay Highway and is the first major mountain encountered in northern New South Wales.

At this time of the year, it is always advisable to take a plentiful supply of warm clothing but the fresh clear days provide ideal weather for bushwalking.
