B. Deletion of the words underlined Section 21

The Annual Election of the General Committee and the Social Sub-Committee shall be conducted as follows:
Section 21 (vi) Election of candidates to positions on General Committee shall be conducted by means of a secret ballot at the April General Meeting in the order detailed in Section 11 (i) And election of the Social Sub-committee shall also be by means of a secret ballot at the April General Meeting except as provided by Section 12 (i)

Section 21 (viii) Extraordinary vacancies occurring on these committees shall be filled in accordance with Section 11 (iii) or 12 (iii) as the case may require.

Addition of the words underlined
Section 12 (i)
The Social Sub-Committee shall consist of 9 members as follows:- The Social Secretary who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting; and four males and four females who shall be elected by secret ballot at the General Meeting following the Annual General Meeting. Other aspects of the electorial procedure to be followed shall be at the discretion of the General Committee.
