Running Creek Falls are considered the most spectacular in Lamington National Park and the trip, in combining the grandeur of the falls with a beautiful and lovely location, should provide a really excellent camping and walking weekend. The Falls are some 300 ft high and are somewhat similar to the Pearling Prook Falls at Springbrook, but they carry a greater volume of water At the foot of the falls is a pool of some 30 yds diameter in which the fall of water causes waves 12" high to radiate to the edges These falls were used as a background for some of the scenes in Charles Chauvel's film "The Sons of Matthew" The camp site will be aituated on the banks of Tunning Creek near

The camp site will be aituated on the banks of Tunning Creek near the Mt Gipps School in a beautiful mountain valley bounded by Mt Gipps and the NS W Forder as well as Mt Chinghee which is covered by dense rain forest, and Neglected Mountain which Bernard O'Leilly proposed some years ago to be called Mt Westray in memory of Jim Westray of the Stinson Clash

On it's lower courses kunning Creek is traversed by the Kyogle Railway Line before it eventually joins the Logan Kiver.

On Saturday the party will go to the foot of the falls through forests of flooded gums and open river flats, finally following a rough track through rain forest prior to a scramble over huge boulders in the creek bed just below the falls.

Sunday it is hoped that a small party will make a fast ascent of Mt Gipps (approx 2,400 ft high)
