BRISBANE CATHOLIC BUSHWALKING CLUB

1. OBJECTS:

- (a) To cater for spiritual and recreational reading consistent with the objects of the Club.
- (b) To encourage an understanding of the Australian Bushland - past and present.
- (c) To provide a Technical Reference Source for the benefit of members.

2. MEMBERSHIP: Membership of the Library is limited to financial members of the Club.

3. FEES: A borrowing charge of One shilling (1/-) per book will be made.

4. PROCEDURE:

- (a) Books will be loaned on the basis of one book per person per month and will be available only at Monthly General meetings.
- (b) Books shall be returned to the Librarian or any other person acting in that capacity at the Monthly General meeting following that at which the books were borrowed.
- (c) Members may make application to borrow a book by entering their names in a Priority book kept by the Librarian for this purpose.
- (d) A member's priority for a particular book will lapse if the member is not available at the General meeting when he has first priority for that book.

5. FINES: Failure to return a book as required in 4(b) will automatically render the hirer liable to a fine of Two shillings (2/-) per month that the book is outstanding.
