BASE CAMP. The campsite will be on Running Creek and will be easily accessible by bus. Water and firewood should both be plentiful.

The Running Creek valley is a really beautiful place appearing to be shut in on all sides by high mountains and appearing also to be completely isolated from the rest of the world. The trip on the Saturday will entail walking up the creek through varying open grass country into thick rain forest to the base of Running Creek falls. Swimming will be available weather permitting. On the Sunday an attempt will be made to reach the interstate railway line if time permits.

THROUGH WALK. It is proposed that this Throughwalk will commence from the Running Creek Valley. The party will climb the McPherson Range in the vicinity of Mt. Gipps & proceed to the Lamington Plateau from where it should be possible to include a visit to the 180ft. Lamington Falls. The return trip to the Running Creek Valley will be via the stretcher track which follows the main ridge running off Lamington plateau. If time permits the lookout above Lamington Glen will be visited & from here grandstand views can be obtained.
