EDITORIAL.

OCTOBER 27TH -- DAY WALK -- IVORY'S ROCKS. Leader BARRY FERRO.

Nominations of 10/-- to Outings Secretary by 21st. October, 1963. (Meeting night). Bus departs Anzac Square (near Tourist Bureau) at 9.0a.m.

Ivory's Rocks are part of the Teviot Range which includes Flinders Peak. There are two formations, one much larger than the other. In the larger Rock there are interesting caves. The views of the area are very good and those who attend should have a rewarding day. The bus fare is extremely reasonable for the distance travelled. Bring full water bottles. (Army Map 1" mile FLINDERS).
