EDITORIAL

### EDITORIAL

There is a great need when bushwalking to be responsible without being inhibited. This need applies to all activities and it is particularly acute when there are obvious dangers and more so if the activity is confined to a small number of people. A few accidents on our mountains in the past months have highlighted this need.

However, often after these occurrences there arise demands that such activities should be banned, or at least severely regulated. Of course this is only natural. It demands that we consider the matter of safety, and the right of each member to decide for himself whether the flame is worth the candle, and included in the cost of the candle must be the worry and effort required of others if things go wrong.

There is no such thing as absolute safety. It is our own duty to see that we do not take too much upon ourselves. We must assess the risks and then do everything possible to minimise them. This applies to everything. We should train and equip ourselves and learn our limitations and not be show-offs. However it does not mean that we should never accept any challenge; that we should be afraid to stand up against natural obstacles. Most outdoor activities, especially bushwalking, can at times entail some risk. Occassionally these get to the headlines but let's try and keep them in perspective. There may be some form of craziness that should be banned but certainly not bushwalking. As members of the Brisbane Catholic Bushwalking Club let us try and retain a sense of responsibility without being inhibited.
