We see people using the club bus at the reduced fare and then see them no more for the weekend as they become house guests for the whole time and only rejoin us when the club bus returns to Brisbane. We do not expect those with other committments to attend many or any trips. We cater for normal healthy enthusiastic people. WEEKEND - MARCH 13/15TH - BASE CAMP BARNEY PORTALS

Nominations of 30/- to Club Box by Morch 6th. Bus leaves 16 Roma Street, 6.30 p.m. on the Friday. Leader BOB SCOTT.

Rising in the great tangled ranges bordered by Barney and Ballow, Mount Barney Creek twists and turns as it gropes for an escape route to reach the Logan River. It finally cuts a passage through the northern bluffs and bursts through two great rocky walls to do so. The first is known as the Upper Portals and the second, which is the venue for this weekend, is the Lower Portals.

The campsite is situated in a pleasant grove between Barney and Maroon a mile or two up from the junction with the Logan River and not too far from the famous Drinans Huts. The bottle brush lined lower reaches contrast strongly with the cliff terilered stream a little to the west of camp and a side watercourse on the Maroon quarter leads to a quite spectacular wet weather waterfall.

The ares offers scope for all classes of walking. The striking serrated skyline of Eagles Ridge, North and Leaning Peaks of Barney looms to the west and the gently rising foothills of Maroon appear to the north. A magnificent pool at the base of the Portals will reward swimmers and a climb over the rock barrier allows the walker to penetrate the interesting chasm as it winds through and around the very heart of Barney. Altogether a most suitable trip for this time of the year.
