Minto Crags (1087') are situated south of Boonah on Teviot Brook, a tributary of the Logan River. The formation is roughly a semi-circle of rock outcrops and the summits afford very good panoramic views of the surrounding countryside. It is good scrambling country with easier routes for the less adventurous. The throughwalkers after climbing Minto Crags Will set off to climb Mt.Moon (2577') and meet the bus on Sunday afternoon. Mt.Moon is a rugged peak with twin peaks of almost equal height. Army map Dugandan 1".

A prompt departure is essential to enable the majority of members to reach the summit (2,247'). It is a long but not a difficult ascent. Day walkers have a chance to climb the most outstanding peak on the skyline west from Brisbane. Views are good and should be of particular interest to those who went on the recent trips to Mt.Goolman and Ivory's Rocks.

The main trip will be to Bald Rock (4190'), south of Mt. Norman and the Pyramids which were visited last May. Bald Rock is reputed to be the largest single lump of granite (prophylitic) in Australia and stands 741' above the surrounding country. Boonoo Boonoo Falls are approximately 600'& fall in three main stages into a deep gorge. There are good pools near the falls and a rough track leads to the bottom of the falls. A feature of the surrounding country is Mt.Prentice (3536'). It is not certain at this stage what attraction will be visited on Monday but some being considered at present are Bluff Rock (3400') south of Tenterfield, The Caves near Stanthorpe (reputed to be Thunderbolt's home for some time), Thompson's Folly, a disused mine near Ballandean, Storm King Dam or Leslie Dam.

Fauna known to be in the areas to be visited include grey roos, red necked Fauna include grey roos, red nec wallables, wallaroos, spiny anteaters, bandicoots, wombats and possums. Birds include both yellow tailed and red tailed cockatoos and crimson rosellas and there are good specimens of stringbark, yellow box, blackbutt, roserras di acacias, ti-trees, banksias etc.

Evening Mass is being arranged at Tenterfield and one night will probably Evening mass the Caravan park there. Remember you will need torch batteries to last for three nights. Check your shoes before leaving as granite wears out shoe treads very quickly. Tentpoles would be desirable also as there may be three different campsites. Bring waterbottles and plenty of warm clothes also. Note you may be doing some climbing and descending sitting down. As there is a long distance to be covered on Friday night a prompt departure from Brisbane is essential. Maps - Army Drake 1", N.S.W.Lands Department Carroll, R.A.C.Q.
