THE CLUB AND YOU

The Club - Its aim

Out first Chaplain/President Rev. Fr. W. Hayes made these remarks

in the first Annual Report:-

"The primary purpose of the Club is to provide a form of beneficial recreation: bushwalking in Brisbane's beautiful surroundings, away from the cramped city and crowded highways. And we have in mind recreation in its full sense, which is a revitalising of the whole person to meet the stress and monotony of work-a-day life. This form of recreation has the advantage of giving its participants a personal knowledge and a keener appreciation of, in fact something akin to affinity with their natural surroundings".

Its success

If our club is to fulfil its role as a club then all members must participate in and take an interest in the activities of the Club. It is important also that the club, within the provisions of its aims, should cater for the needs of its members.

You

Remember that your subscription makes you a member of a bushwalking club, not a shareholder in a company organizing bushwalks nor a charitable donor to a society needing money.

As stated previously bushwalking is primarily a recreation. Everyone (even married persons, student and those that <u>feel</u> too old) needs recreation. So as a member of the club you should take advantage of club outings. If you come on trips then your friends will probably start coming too, but someone has to decide that they are willing to make the effort (and it is some effort to make provision to go on a walk). Why don't you give the lead? Walk more in 64.

Finally, the type of environment in which we undertake our recreation requires members to have a knowledge of certain bushcraft lore and skills. Bushwalker is a description that implies a degree of skill and responsibility above and beyond that expected from the average person walking in the bush. Responsible and intelligent behavior is demanded of all persons wishing to call themselves bushwalkers. Therefore you should take every opportunity to become a better bushwalker. We don't want country people to regard bushwalkers as a mob of "city yahoos" who come out in the bush and make a suisance of themselves.

Note - For the information of the curious the preceeding remarks are not the result of any previous club activity. It is the authors belief that there is a need for a greater effort by all members to be more active, and also to take a more intelligent and responsible attitude to bushwalking.
