REPORT ON NATIONAL PARKS CONFERENCE

During the weekend 26th to 29th June, five members of the Club nominated to attend the first Conference on National Parks to be held in Queensland. It was organised by the National Parks Association of Queensland and took place at Camp Stacey, Cunningham's Gap. Approximately 60 persons attended, including some from New South Wales, Stanthorpe, and Wyberba.

The five speakers presented different viewpoints on National Parks. The first speaker, Dr. Pat. Marks, gave a Field Naturalists views. She summarised the provisions of various Queensland Acts which give protection to fauna and flora and made a plea, in particular, for the better protection of invertebrates.

Mr. Edgar Kemp, President of N.P.A.Q. then talked about his Association and National Parks. He outlined the development of National Parks Associations in Australia and overseas and stressed the urgency of providing for the future use of National Parks, including the provision of expert information for park visitors.

Mr. Graham Tweedale gave a geological picture of National Parks in South East Queensland, illustrating different types of rocks and formations with colour slides. He also showed slides of several areas proposed by N.P.A.Q. as National Parks.

Mrs. Thistle Y.Stead (Thistle Y. Harris) gave a summary of the achievements and plans of the Wild Life Research Foundation in the commencement of "Wirrimbirra Wild Life Sanctuary" near Bargo N.S.W. and showed some slides of the area.

Mr. Tom Young, President of Brisbane Bushwalkers, addressed the Conference on Bushwalkers' views on National Parks. He explained that bushwalkers were by nature interested in conservation because they appreciated that without National Parks there would soon be very few places for them to bushwalk. He discussed the methods by which here, as in other States, bushwalkers had assisted in having areas proclaimed as National Parks, establishing a Safety and Training organisation, and in mapping and track marking.

Mr. Keith Jarrott, Secretary of N.P.A.Q. furnished details of areas presently under consideration as National Parks (including

some shown pretiously by Mr. Tweedale in slides), and suggested types of country which still had to be included in National Parks.

After each talk there were interesting discussions on various points made by the speakers,

During Saturday afternoon those attending walked in the Cunningham's Gap National Park, and Mts. Cordeaux and Mitchell were climbed by various parties. The weather was pleasant, with cold nights, and the views good.

The weekend was very enjoyable, as well as instructive and I hope that this Conference will be the first of many. It is an ideal opportunity for members of different organisations to get to know each other and exchange views on common interests and problems.
