SOF THE LISS ATTRACTIVE FEATURES OF OUR BUSH

Did you 'mow that more people have died in Australia from the effects of tick-poisoning than from spider bites? Apparently between 1904 and 1945 20 tick bite deaths were recorded, only three being over the age of three years. They are serious enough however in adults to be treated with cautior.

Without rishing to alarm you I would suggest that it should be routine to check for ticks after an outing in the bush. If any ticks have become attached to you I quote from "ustralian Spiders" by Keith C.McKeown regarding their removal:

"It is generally believed that when removing a tick it is dangerous to leave the moth-parts embedded in the flesh, but this is not so; they are of no more importance than a small splinter, and will come out of their own accord. Frequéntly the tick is first hilled by the application of kerosene, turpentire, or methylated spirits, but this serves no good purpose; it is wholly unnecessary." In most cases, where there is no allergic reaction, a tick detected within a few hours is no more serious than a same sandfly or a mosquito.

Leeches - such a familiar part of our rain forests are usually more of a nuisance than anything else. Some unfortunate people suffer a violent reaction to leech bites. Prevention is much better than cure, and protective clothing is of benefit when going into rain forest during rain. Leeches are far better removed before they are ready to drop off.

Spiders are often regarded with suspicion, although harmless. To date about 1500 different species of spiders have been classified in Australia and only three types are definitely known to be deadly - the Trap Door or Funnelwebs of the Sydney and N.S.W.North Coast areas and the Red Back or Jockey spider. We are unlikely to meet these, and in fact spider bites generally are rare. Apparently spider bites should be given similar first aid to that given for snake bite.
