The Shipton Track should also be at its best, for it is noted for its wonderful display of wildflowers, and by October should be a blaze of colour.

This Through-Walk will be through some of the most beautiful country in the National Park. West Canungra Creek is especially attractive and for those who have never been further along it than Stairway Falls, here is your chance. It is to be noted that this walk which is by no means difficult, is however of a reasonably high standard.
