EDITORIAL

SYMBOLISM OF THE CLUB BADGE

How many members looking at our club badge really know just what it is all about and why it was designed this way.

At a Farwell Dinner held for Rev. Fr. Hayes (who was the founder of the club) in March, 1961, John Power, who later followed Father to Ireland to study for the priesthood, drew particular attention to the Club Badge in replying to the toast to the Club in the following words which explain very clearly its symbolsim:-

Our Club badge epitomizes in a very clear way the spirit of the Club. On the apex of the triangular shaped badge, there is a white star on the blue ground, representing Our Lady; three rays of light fal from the star of rest on a three-peaked mountain - the mountain of achievement; whilst at the base of the mountain on an off-set cross burns the fire of inthusiasm; and at the base of the badge there is the Club motto "Duce Maria" - with Mary leading. If the central ray of light were projected down, it would pass through the mountain of

achievement, through the fire of enthusiasm, through the cross, to rest on the motto - thus forming a symbolic link.

You see, therefore, that the corner-stone of our Club is enthusiasm and achievement through Mary. My earnest hope is this, that the fire of enthusiasm symbolised on our Club badge, by which we now overcome the natural difficulties experienced in mountaineering and bushwalking, be transformed by the Holy Spirit, so that the crosses of life may be met with the same fortitude and so that, with Mary as our leader, we may climb to the crest of the real mountain of achievement, namely, union with her Divine Son.

Now having read this article let it be hoped that you the present members of this club carry on the aims and enthusiasm of our foundation members.
