GENERAL MEETINGS Meetings are held on the 3rd Monday of every month, at 7:30pm. The location is St Brigid's Parish Hall, Musgrave Rd, RED HILL. VISITORS are always welcome. OUTINGS

- Always read the Jilalan article to check the departure point, date and time. Walk departures are usually from Red Hill Parish Hall, Musgrave Rd. Check "Jilalan" or phone the leader to determine the location
- The club will usually organise transport for each outing, but you must nominate in advance to the leader. Contacting someone else may lead to your nomination becoming "lost". Nominations should (c) preferably be made by the Monday prior to the activity (Wednesday at the latest) so that transport etc. can be arranged. Note that nominations for some walks may close well in advance of this. Late nominations may not be accepted.
- Walkers are responsible for their own transport to and from the departure point. (d)
- (e) Walks are rarely cancelled - if they are, all nominees will be notified. Should you change your mind and decide not to come to a club event, please notify the leader as soon as possible.

(f) Visitors who done more than 3 walks must sign an Assumption of Risk form for insurance. EMERGENCY OFFICER

If, within the hour prior to an outing's departure, you can't make it or you are running late, phone the number shown in the Jilalan for the Emergency Officer for that outing. If you have not returned from an outing by 9:00pm your family may ring the Emergency Officer – but please don't panic. EQUIPMENT HIRE

The Club has some tents and through-walk packs to hire to visitors and newer members. Borrowers are responsible for collecting and returning equipment, as well as making good any loss or damage over and above normal wear and tear. Hire rates - Packs \$10/ weekend, Tents \$5:00 - Deposit of \$20:00 required. PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

The Association requires that all walkers on all trips should carry certain minimal basic equipment. This should comprise the following - a first aid kit, a torch, a parka/raincoat, hat, shirt 30+ sunscreen and at least 2 litres of water. Leaders may require that walkers carry other equipment. Advice of this will be given in Jilalan and/or by the leader.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

All members are most welcome to attend a meeting of the Management Committee, but please contact the President beforehand. This means you can be advised of any change of date/venue. If you feel strongly about an issue, bring it along to the Committee Meeting and we'll put it on the agenda.

All members are encouraged to consider these changes. As with all changes to the constitution, any motions will be 'on the table' for an appropriate period of time. It is hoped that a motion will be formulated at the next meeting, which will be placed in the December and January magazines, before any vote by members is undertaken.

There is also a proposal to change By Laws 01.01, 16.01 and 16.03, which relate to administrative changes to accurately reflect how activities are now currently undertaken.

1. That the following rules relating to Associate Members be changed. These changes will allow Associate Members to be allowed to vote at general meetings and to be elected to most positions on the club's committee except President and Vicepresident. The membership fees will also be altered to reflect this proposal.

That the rules relating to certain By-Laws be changed to reflect the current activities within the club.
