

Articles for "Jilalan" should be posted to Cecilia Doherty 17 Gloucester Crescent, Bray Park 4500. Please note deadlines for submitting articles on paper and on disk as shown in the calendar. The Editor uses MS WORD 7.0 but can convert from most programs. Please submit a hard copy of the article for backup should your disk fail. GENERAL MEETINGS

Meetings are held on the 3rd Monday of every month, at 7.30 p.m (although they usually start about 15 minutes later). The location is The Little King's Centre, 33 O'Keefe Street, Buranda. VISITORS are always welcome.

OUTINGS

- (a) Always read the Jilalan article to check the departure point, date and time.
- (b) Departure of walks is usually either from the rear of the Cathedral in Charlotte Street or at Sullivan & Nicolaides (134 Whitmore Street, Taringa enter via the upper driveway and drive down to the upper level of the carpark). Check "Jilalan" or phone the leader to be certain.
- (c) The Club will usually organise transport for each outing, but you must nominate in advance to the leader. Contacting someone else may lead to your nomination becoming "lost". Nominations should preferably be made by the Monday prior to the activity (Wednesday at the latest) so that transport etc. can be arranged. Note that nominations for some walks may close well in advance of this. Late nominations may not be accepted.
- (d) Walkers are responsible for their transport to and from the departure point.
- (e) Walks are rarely cancelled if they are, all nominees will be notified. Should you change your mind and decide not to come to a club event, please notify the leader as soon as possible.

EMERGENCY OFFICER

If, within the hour prior to an outings' departure, you can't make it or you are running late, phone the number shown in the "Jilalan" for the Emergency Officer for that outing. If you have not returned from an outing by 9.00 p.m. your family may ring the Emergency Officer - but please don't panic.

EQUIPMENT HIRE

The Club has some tents and through-walk packs to hire to visitors and newer members. Borrowers are responsible for collecting and returning equipment, as well as making good any loss or damage over and above normal wear and tear. Hire rates - Packs \$10/weekend, Tents \$5.00 - Deposit of \$20 required.

PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

The Association requires that certain minimal basic equipment should be carried by all walkers on all trips. This should comprise the following - a first aid kit, a torch, a parka/raincoat, hat, shirt, 15+ (or suitable value), sun screen and at least 2 litres of water. Leaders may require that walkers carry other equipment. Advice of this will be given in "Jilalan" and/or by the leader.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

All members are most welcome to observe the next meeting of the Management Committee. You are very welcome to attend the meeting but <u>please contact the President beforehand</u>. This means you can be advised of any change of date/venue. If you feel strongly about an issue, bring it along to the Committee Meeting and we'll put it on the agenda.

I might take the family up earlier, so if you nominate late, and cannot get on to me, ring the Dolans who will take your nomination and arrange for you to squeeze into a car.

The Bunya Mountains, in summer, are about 10 degrees cooler than the plane below. In winter, this is the next most common place for snow after Stanthorpe. Thus, it is nice and green. The grass is lush, the Bunya Pines a deep green and the creeks have permanent water. You will never forget the mist swirling in the valleys, the breeze blowing it up your feet, then a parting and seeing the plane below, only to be swallowed up again.

The walking begins for the lucky ones with a stroll to Tim Shea Falls upon arrival to boil the You will pass through Pine Gorge Lookout.

Next morning, the team will check out the Living stump, and do the tracks from Dandabah, visiting such nice places as Pine Gorge Lookout (again),

BIG Falls lookout and Barkers Lookout (overlooking the plane to the east seeing towards Toorong, BIG Falls themselves and believe it or not LITTLE FALLS, and then I will take you to Paradise (Falls). All very pretty and most unusual country for those who have not been there before

On the morrow, we all will go to the Western Cliffs circuit, which follows the top of the escarpment from Burtons Well to Dandabah. This starts in open eucalypt country, with many view spots looking over the dry dusty plane towards Dalby in the background. It is a long, but rewarding walk. You will enter the rainforest on the last leg, seeing the tall Bunya pines.

Monday will see us doing the track to the old timber chute, where the timber getters sent the logs down the mountain side on rails. Then pack up and go home via Maidenwell and the Brisbane Valley Highway.

A trip well worth doing. Bring along one pack only, and squeeze all your things into it. Try not to bring those large eskies. It can get cold there even in summer so bring some warm clothing.

Considering the packing limitations, we traditionally try to make Saturday night dinner a little feast with shared desserts and goodies.

BEACH PARTY 1997 - December 7th








With fine blue skies, warm weather and a southeasterly zephyr gently cooling us, we hit the water early.
