#### GENERAL MEETINGS

Meetings are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of every month, at 7:30pm. The location is St Brigid's Parish Hall, Musgrave Rd, RED HILL, VISITORS are always welcome.

#### OUTINGS

- (a) Always read the Jilalan article to check the departure point, date and time.
- (b) Departure of walks is usually either from the Old Windmill on Wickham Tce or at Sullivan & Nicolaides (134 Whitmore Street, Taringa enter via the upper driveway and drive down to the upper level of the carpark). Check "Jilalan" or phone the leader to be certain.
- (c) The club will usually organise transport for each outing, but you must nominate in advance to the leader. Contacting someone else may lead to your nomination becoming "lost". Nominations should preferably be made by the Monday prior to the activity (Wednesday at the latest) so that transport etc. can be arranged. Note that nominations for some walks may close well in advance of this. Late nominations may not be accepted.
- (d) Walkers are responsible for their own transport to and from the departure point.
- (e) Walks are rarely cancelled if they are, all nominees will be notified. Should you change your mind and decide not to come to a club event, please notify the leader as soon as possible.

#### **EMERGENCY OFFICER**

If, within the hour prior to an outing's departure, you can't make it or you are running late, phone the number shown in the Jilalan for the Emergency Officer for that outing. If you have not returned from an outing by 9:00pm your family may ring the Emergency Officer – but please don't panic.

#### EQUIPMENT HIRE

The Club has some tents and through-walk packs to hire to visitors and newer members. Borrowers are responsible for collecting and returning equipment, as well as making good any loss or damage over and above normal wear and tear. Hire rates – Packs \$10/weekend, Tents \$5:00 – Deposit of \$20:00 required.

#### PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

The Association requires that all walkers on all trips should carry certain minimal basic equipment. This should comprise the following – a first aid kit, a torch, a parka/raincoat, hat, shirt 30+ sunscreen and at least 2 litres of water. Leaders may require that walkers carry other equipment. Advice of this will be given in Jilalan and/or by the leader.

#### MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

All members are most welcome to attend a meeting of the Management Committee, but please contact the President beforehand. This means you can be advised of any change of date/venue. If you feel strongly about an issue, bring it along to the Committee Meeting and we'll put it on the agenda.

Six club members met up at the Gantry Day Rest Area in the Mt Mee State Forest. This area is so-named after the huge gantry crane, which was used in a sawmill on the site. The building is now being preserved as a part of history, and a plaque near the front gives some of the details of its past history.

We made a good start, taking both vehicles onto State Forest roads. We had a permit from the DNR for a Group Activity, a process which now no longer requires the registration number of all vehicles before the permit can be issued. Congrats to those responsible. We left the cars at a spot called HAKEA, and set off down a 4WD track. At a tiny creek, we headed downstream to the top of a waterfall. The leader searched in vain for a sighting of a primitive plant (Psilotum sp) spotted here on an earlier trip. When offered the choice, the troops opted for the steeper, unsurveyed route down to the main creek and Matthew led the way.

We struck our destination creek right at the junction, and voted against a trip downstream for our first swim. (The weather was overcast and cool, which was a pity, as the day had been planned as a swimming trip.) ## Snippets from the Border Survey (NPA News)...

From 23 March 1863 to 17 September 1866, Surveyor Francis Roberts was engaged in marking the boundary line between Queensland and New South Wales, from Point Danger on the coast to the Dumaresq or Severn River. In the course of the task, Surveyor Roberts travelled through and over the future border ranges national parks. To give some idea of the difficulties under which Roberts worked, a snippet from one of his letters to the Queensland Surveyor General.

"Sir, I am now camped at Mt Gipps twenty miles east of Mt Lindsey and am working towards the coast to near Mt Rowland. From Mt Lindsey I cut and marked the line as far as Mt Glennie the face of which is a wall of rock, whose top is quite inaccessible on the north, west and south sides, and the range itself unapproachable from that point to this place without great loss of time and labour in cutting through dense scrubs many miles in depth.

"To get here I had to run down to the Richmond River twenty three miles and up Findon and Gradys Creeks about forty miles. From this point I hope to be enabled to work easterly to meet Mr Rowland and westerly to Mt Glennie.

I have the honour to be your obedient servant F E Roberts - Surveyor"
