GENERAL MEETINGS

Retings are held on the 3rd Monday of every month, at 7:30pm. The location is St Brigid's Parish Hall, Musgrave Rd, RED HILL. VISITORS are always welcome.

OUTINGS

- (a) Always read the Jilalan article to check the departure point, date and time.
- (b) Walk departures are usually from Red Hill Parish Hall, Musgrave Rd. Check "Jilalan" or phone the leader to determine the location.
- (c) The club will usually organise transport for each outing, but you must nominate in advance to the leader. Contacting someone else may lead to your nomination becoming "lost". Nominations should preferably be made by the Monday prior to the activity (Wednesday at the latest) so that transport etc. can be arranged. Note that nominations for some walks may close well in advance of this. Late nominations may not be accepted.
- (d) Walkers are responsible for their own transport to and from the departure point.
- (e) Walks are rarely cancelled if they are, all nominees will be notified. Should you change your mind and decide not to come to a club event, please notify the leader as soon as possible.

(f) Visitors who done more than 3 walks must sign an Assumption of Risk form for insurance.

EMERGENCY OFFICER

If, within the hour prior to an outing's departure, you can't make it or you are running late, phone the number shown in the Jilalan for the Emergency Officer for that outing. If you have not returned from an outing by 9:00pm your family may ring the Emergency Officer – but please don't panic.

EQUIPMENT HIRE

The Club has some tents and through-walk packs to hire to visitors and newer members. Borrowers are responsible for collecting and returning equipment, as well as making good any loss or damage over and above normal wear and tear. Hire rates – Packs \$10/ weekend, Tents \$5:00 – Deposit of \$20:00 required.

PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

The Association requires that all walkers on all trips should carry certain minimal basic equipment. This should comprise the following – a first aid kit, a torch, a parka/raincoat, hat, shirt 30+ sunscreen and at least 2 litres of water. Leaders may require that walkers carry other equipment. Advice of this will be given in Jilalan and/or by the leader.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

All members are most welcome to attend a meeting of the Management Committee, but please contact the President beforehand. This means you can be advised of any change of date/venue. If you feel strongly about an issue, bring it along to the Committee Meeting and we'll put it on the agenda.

The Conondales are in the highlands behind the North Coast. The area is a haven of rainforest along the creeks surrounded by eucalypt forest. There are many creeks flowing into the 2 main ones – Booloomba and Little Yabba.

You will camp at the Booloomba Camping Ground over night. Have dinner at home before you start out; you will need a good long sleep Saturday night. In the morning, the party will follow the little Lobster Creek up to its headwaters – yes, you may be able to see a freshwater lobster or two if conditions are right. This is a pretty little creek, with rock slabs in sections, small rocks most of the way, water flowing most of the time and lush deep green rainforest types of plant-life coming down to and overhanging the banks. There will be a couple of waterfalls to climb around. You will be rock hopping, running along the slabs and going along through the rainforest banks during the day at different times.

At the top, we get out of the watercourse, and head up to the top of the ridge. From here, we are in the full daylight, though at this point there are not long views. Then there is a stroll around to the Breadknife – a tower of rock that sticks up in the middle of the junction of 2 creeks, like a giant index finger pointing to the sky. The group will carefully climb this. At its feet are several good deep pools, scoured out of the creek floor by millennia of floods.

After a short rest here, the team will head up an open eucalypt ridge and follow its crest. There are full views from this across Booloomba Ck – overlooking the winding creek far down below, seeing the dark rainforest along its banks and looking at the forest climb on the steep ridge to the crest opposite. Once we are far enough along our ridge, we will descend into the creek near the old gold mine – it we get there near dusk, we will see thousands of little bats exiting for a night's feeding. Stand back or they will take you with them! Then it is a matter of following the graded track back to camp, again through dense rainforest.

We should get back late in the afternoon – I have planned a full day for you. The trip is long; there is a mixture of territory – creek rocks, rock hopping, clambering up beside waterfalls, going up ridges and down a steep grassy ridge back to the creek. A rewarding day for you who come. Bring sun protection, a torch, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lunches, hat,

camera, a sense of humour and wear comfortable footwear with good grip.

You will have to pay the camping fee upon arrival - at the honesty box in Booloomba Camping Ground. Unlimited spaces available. Don't let the lack of a tent stop you₌ a spot can be arranged when we see who nominates. Transport will also be arranged then.

OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST

Cuthbertson Peaks

Some of you may be aware that some years ago there was a proposal by Brisbane Bushwalkers Club to name the double knoll located between Mt Doubletop and Spicers Peak in Main Range National Park as "Cuthbertson Peaks", in honour of the late Jim Cuthbertson who was well known in bushwalking and conservation circles for the Scenic Rim for some 4 decades until his death in 1993.

I have only just found out that this was processed and approved on 12 January 2001, almost a year ago. Accordingly, "Cuthbertson Peaks" is now the official place name for this double knoll. Those people who knew Jim - a simple dignified man with a great interest in natural history and the Scenic Rim - will no doubt appreciate how fitting it is that his name will always be associated with this landscape.

As well as being proposed by BBW, the proposal was officially supported by both the QPWS and the RACQ. Jim worked as a cartographer for the RACQ for many decades. Those of you who remember the original black and white RACQ road maps from the 1960s and 1970s - well, Jim produced those (showing my age, aren't f). My thanks to BBW for pursuing the proposal and to DNR officials for progressing it.
