# OUTINGS IN RETROSPECT

Condamine Gorge (23-26th April)

<u>Throughwalk</u> - The throughwalk was led by Baul Skehan and started off by climbing onto Pat's Plains and following a timber track to Hall's Plains. From here another timber track was followed to Conn's Plains, arriving between 3 and 4 in the afternoon. Night was spent on Emu Creek.

In the morning a timber track which ran up the South Branch of Enu Creek past the Steamers was followed. The ridge separating Superbus and Conn's Plains was traversed and then the party changed tracks and headed south, passing the Lincoln Wreck track and coming into open country near the base of Mt, Superbus. The Condamine gorge road was followed out and after making eleven creek crossings, arrived back at camp about five.

Owing to the size of the party - only four members, much wildlife was observed on this trip,

Base Camp - The base camp of nine people was led by Gavin Clancy. Decause some members did not walk in (through 3 creek crossings) on Friday night to the campsite near the 4th creek crossing, a late start was made on Saturday morning. This necessitated the taking of an easier walk than was originally planned, and Pat's Plains were visited.

On Sunday, after another delayed start, a party visited a fairly large cave just below the cliffline behind the camp, then followed the base of the cliff round to a break in the cliff and continued onto the top, obtaining very good views of Mts. Barney, Maroon, Wilson's Peak and Condamine Gorge itself. After returning to camp and being rejoined by the throughwalkers, an early tea was had and Mass was attended in Killarney.

Con Monday, the basecampers followed the old road up to Condamine Gorge, The party returned to Brisbane by 6 p.m.
