There are a number of comments I would like to make concerning trips. Firstly some general comments:

More and more new members are coming on trips (don't clap yet!) but fewer and fewer of the experienced ones. This is causing a trans-portation crisis - few of the new members have cars or access to them_- and also makes for a less enjoyable trip because the more established walkers get camps set up more efficiently and usually are the stirrers at campfires.

SOLUTION - more of the established walkers (I'm talking about 12 months experience or more) to come on trips. I can't force you but let me say emphatically that Your Club Needs YOU !

Now for the guts of the stuff:

because of our transportation crisis rather elaborate arrangements have to be made to assure transport on trips and to keep the club solvent. Of course if we could fit six people and packs into a four cylinder car our problems would be solved but we only have one vehicle in the entire club capable of this feat at present. On the Wyberba trip only nine out of an original eighteen nominations could be taken because of this problem.

Further complications arise when people do not pay, but nominate, then cancel and upset all my arrangements at the eleventh hour. A variation of this is for people not to nominate, but turn up anyway, and then not bother to pay.

Trips are organised POR the club members, and prices set are the minimum possible for bus cost or remuneration of car drivers. Your Outings Secretary is NOT a winard who can conjure up cars at a moments notice; he is doing the best he can under needlessly difficult conditions.

SOLUTION - One solution to be aimed at is for about thirty or more members per trip: that way we could hire a bus economically every time. This is not likely to be the usual thing for a while but I am working on it!

What I intend to do is this:

- i) Nominations with money will be the only ones accepted
- ii) The closing date for nomination is usually the Monday before the trip and I will organise transport no later than the Wodnesday night
- iii) Any nominations not communicated to me by 7.00 p.m. on the Wednesday night will have to take their chances. If we have transport spare - 0.K, if not, then I will not break all my arrangements to satisfy some tardy person unless they have a b.... good reason.

In closing let no say that those arrangements are not just those of a bureaucrat flexing bis muscles for fun; I wont the Club to go ahead this year with good trips and bigger walking numbers, and this is the only way left to ensure that trips are organised on a stable basis and that we don't go down in a heap, moneywise.

Superbus-Steamers Throughwalk - The walk will commence on the eastern side of Mt. Superbus and proceed along a ridge to meet the rabbit fence which leads to Mt. Superbus. It will then continue north along the range to Mt. Roberts, from where it will proceed to Lizard's Point at which Saturday night will be spent and from where superb views can be obtained. On Sunday, Mt.Steamer will be visited as well as the Stern. The walk will proceed along the bottom of the Steamers passing the Mast, Tunnel and then drop down to the basecamp when the Prow is reached. On Monday the Lincoln Wreck will be visited from the basecamp. Although it will be a bit chilly, comfortable camps are assured.

Superbus-Wilsons Peak:- The basecamp will be on the South branch of Emu Creek, below the Prow of the Steamers. Day walks proposed are:

- 1. To Lizard's Point via South Branch of Emu Creek and along the Main Range. The view from Lizard's Point is the BEST on the Main Range and gives an uninters rupted view of the whole range from well north of Cunninghams Gap to past Teviot Gap to the south. This includes Mt. Barney/Mt. Ballow massive. The return trip may include the Stern of the Steamers which provides the best view of the Steamers. This has to be seen to be believed.
- 2. The Lincoln Wreck the easy way. This way the 'Gympie' up Superbus is missed. The only problem is locating the wreck but we should have more time to do this than the throughwalkers. If anyone wanted to, we could continue on to Mt. Superbus along the ridge. This is the HIGHEST mountain in Southern Qld.
- 3. Ascent of the Prow of the Steamers This is said to be possible!! We plan to try it anyway. From here you will be able to see the stupendous STEAMER FORMATION.

The purpose of this is that new members and visitors may hire the equipment required for walks. This equipment is for use on Club outings ONLY. New members are advised that once they decide to become active bushwalkers they are expected to provide their own equipment. This will also enable them to participate on private trips trips which are quite rewarding. For information on the purchase of new equipment are advised to contact the Safety and Training Officer. The Outings Secretary is advised that he will not consider a nomination for a bushwalking trip valid unless the nomination fee is paid by the Wednesday before the trip. To assist members who have a liquidity problem it has been proposed and accepted that members may pay their nomination fees straight into the Club's Bank Account. This may be arranged by payment into any branch of the Commonwealth Savings Bank and the members should obtain a duplicate and triplicate of the deposit slip. OUTINGS IN RETROSPECT

BUCHANAN'S FORT: The throughwalkers made an early start on the Saturday morning and started the climb onto Buchanan's Fort. After following a fairly steep ridge the top was attained. From here the party continued on to Little Widgee. A road was then followed back towards Mt. Neglected. Night was spent in a small cave on the lower slopes of this mountain. The next morning the mountain was climbed and the party then followed a very narrow razorback fro some distance before dropping off the ridge towards the campsite. A hut was found from which a road was followed back to the camp.

Saturday morning saw the basecampers heading east for Westray's Grave. When the road finished a track was followed up Christmas Creek to a pool where lunch was eaten. The party then moved further up the creek to inspect the grave. While most remained on the creek and later made their way back to the camp some more energetic members started up a very steep **s**lope for the Stinson wreck. After a quick, stremuous slog the site of the wreck was reached and the remains examined. Hard to imagine that that scrap once flew. As it was now getting late the party beat a hasty retreat. After picking up our packs at the lunch site a very fast trip was made down the track emerging from the park just before sunset. A heisurely walk back to the dairy was the order of the day, time being taken to observe the various celestial bodies that were now clearly visible. From the dairy the party was driven back to camp.

Sunday: After a late start 10 members set out to climb Buchanan's Fort. After climbing up to a rock formation most continued on while four members gave the formation a closer look. The forward party made it to the top while the rear members found the going more difficult and did not if fact reach the top. After waiting for the return of the rest of the party a quick return was made to camp. Mass was attended in Brisbane.
