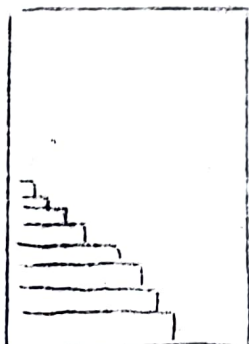

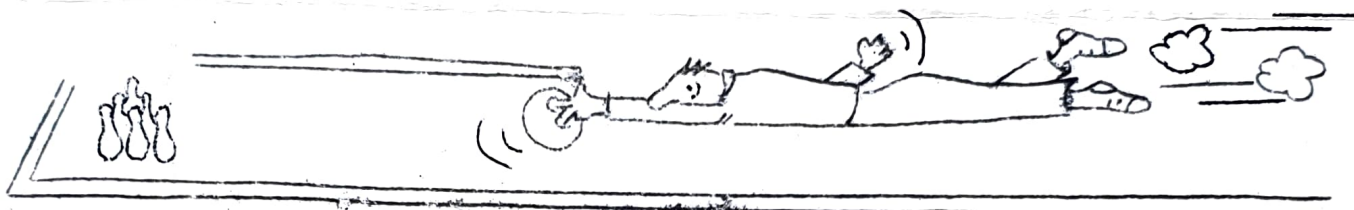

Sunday will see us on EggRock (bring your friction grip boots for the rock slab) then back to Binna Burra for a late afternoon tea.

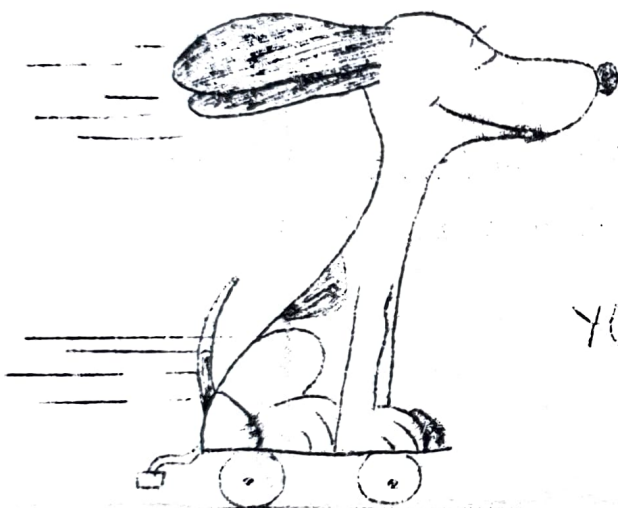
Special attraction : exit from Turtle Rock is via the tree growing against the northern cliffs.
