The throughwalk will start off by moving up towards Leaning Peak which the party will climb. After abseiling off the party will then move up to the hut in the saddle between East Peak (4,449') and West. Savages Ridge will be the route for the way out.

The Base - campers will climb Mt. on Saturday before starting back to camp at Dayman's Hut. Sunday will be spent in the area around the Lower Portals.

AMENDMENT TO CONSTITUTION

I propose that the first sentence of section 9(iv) of the constitution should be amended to read as follows:-

"Four accounts shall be maintained by the Club. The first account shall be named "Brisbane Catholic Bushwalking Club - General Account" and the President, Vice-President, General Secretary and Treasurer shall be authorised to operate the account. The second account shall be named "Brisbane Catholic Bushwalking Club - Outings Account" and the President, Vice-President, Outings Secretary and the Treasurer shall be authorised to operate the account. The third account shall be named "Brisbane Catholic Bushwalking Club - Socials Account" and the President, Vice-President, Social Secretary and the Treasurer shall be authorised to operate the account. The fourth account shall be named "Brisbane Catholic Bushwalking Club - Safety and Training Account" and the President, Vice-President, Safety and Training Officer and the Treasurer shall be authorised to operate the account. On all the above accounts any two officers shall operate the accounts and the signature of any one of the above office bearers shall be sufficient endorsement for cheques and other negotiable instruments.
