IMENDIENT TO CONSTITUTION

The fourth account shall be named "Brisbane Catholic Bushwalking Club -Safety and Training Account" and the President, Vice- President, Safety and Training Officer and the Treasurer shall be authorised to operate the account. On all the above accounts any two officers shall operate the accounts and the signature of any one of the above office bearers shall be sufficent endorsement for cheques and other negotiable instruments.
