


EQUIPMENT HIRE



EXTENDED TRIP FOR NEW YEAR - NANDEWARS

BIRD OF THE MONTH

Crimson Rosella, Platycercus elegans

This bird can be found in the rain forest areas of eastern Australia from Cooktown in the north to Sydney in the south. This variety of Rosella is 32cm (12½ inches) long with a tail length of 17cm (6½ inches).

As implied in the name, the bird has a crimson body with purple-blue wings. It usually makes a pleasant, but slightly shrill call which sounds like "Trin-see, Trin-see".

The stable food is seed especially crop seed such as maize or sorghum. The nesting season is September to December. The nest will usually be found in a hole of a gum tree with two to five pure white eggs in it.

There's a good chance you might see one of these birds on your next trip to O'Reillys.

CAR RALLY


18th November Gost \$1.50 ARE YOU COMING!
