EDITORIAL - Safety & Training

Later this month we have programmed a Safety and Training weekend. If this follows the usual pattern, there will be only a small attendance.

Before each Safety & Training weekend, the S.& T. Officer puts a lot of work into organisation. For instance, this weekend we will be concentrating on first aid, rockclimbing and rescue, and preparation for this will entail a considerable amount of time. Also a member of F.M.R. (Federation Mountain Rescue) will be coming along to give us help with rope work. It would be unfortunate if he gave up his time and few people were there to learn from him.

Members are surely all safety conscious and an S.& T. weekend provides the opportunity of learning how to apply safety principles while out bushwalking.

While prevention is naturally better than cure, we do have good news for all those bushwalkers who become seriously "geographically embarrassed" or who meet with a major accident on future trips. F.M.R. is currently undertaking a massive overhaul of its operations. If a rescue beyond the resources of an individual club becomes necessary, then an F.M.R. Contact Officer can be notified. Through a system of individual Club Contact Officers, a large number of people can be called on to provide assistance in a relatively short period.

As those called out will all be reasonably active bushwalkers they will have some idea of how to conduct themselves in the bush. However, a trained group is naturally far more effective. For this reason, F.M.R. is undertaking training sessions for members of the various clubs. As well as being interesting and informative these also prove most enjoyable. Next training night will be held on Tuesday 26th November at 7.30 p.m. We will be meeting at Petrie Terrace Police Station and travelling to Mt. Coot-tha where we will practise stretcher handling and communication.

The day may well come when you, or one of your friends, need the help of either a club or an F.M.R. rescue team. The knowledge that trained people are available is most comforting at a time like that. SO - come on the Club S.& T. weekend, and try to make it to the F.M.R. Training night. Who knows when the things you learn will have to be used!

end-of-year exams.

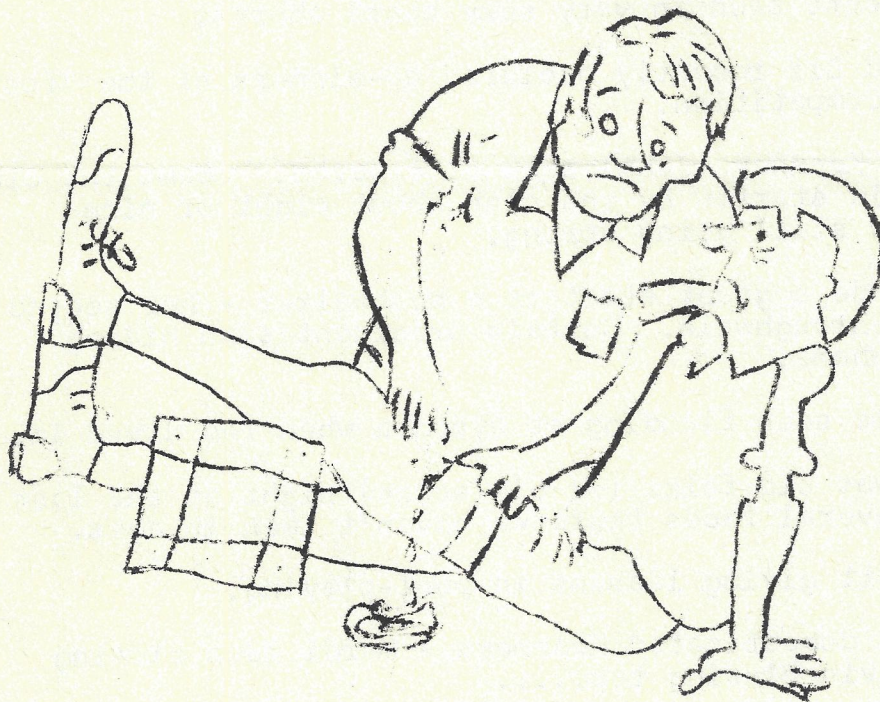
