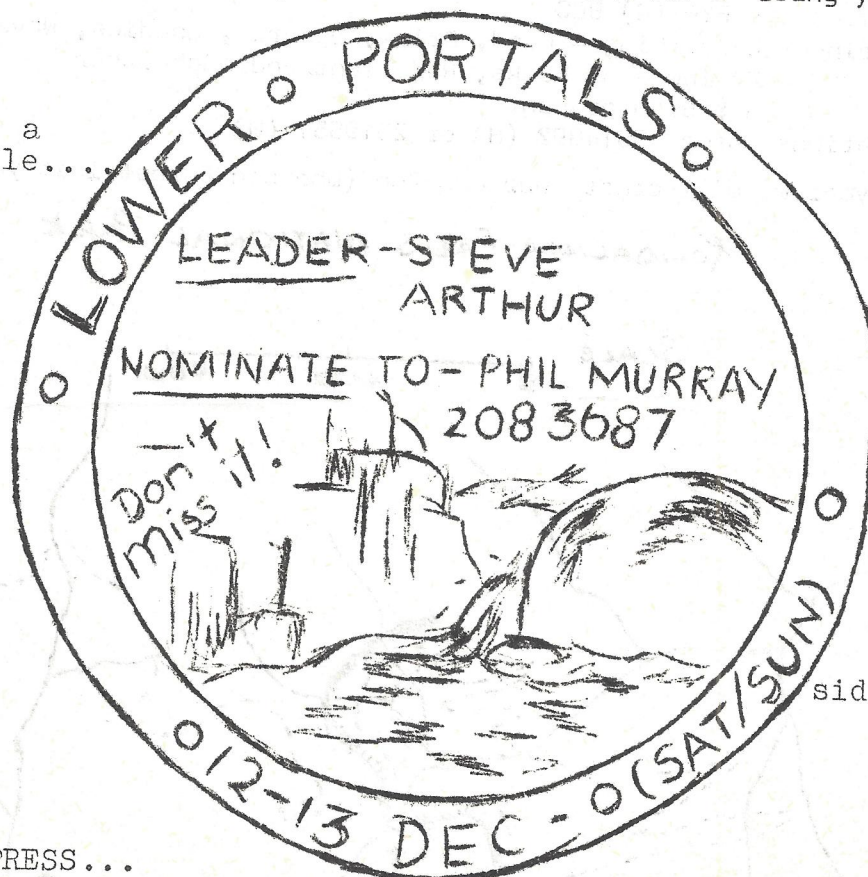

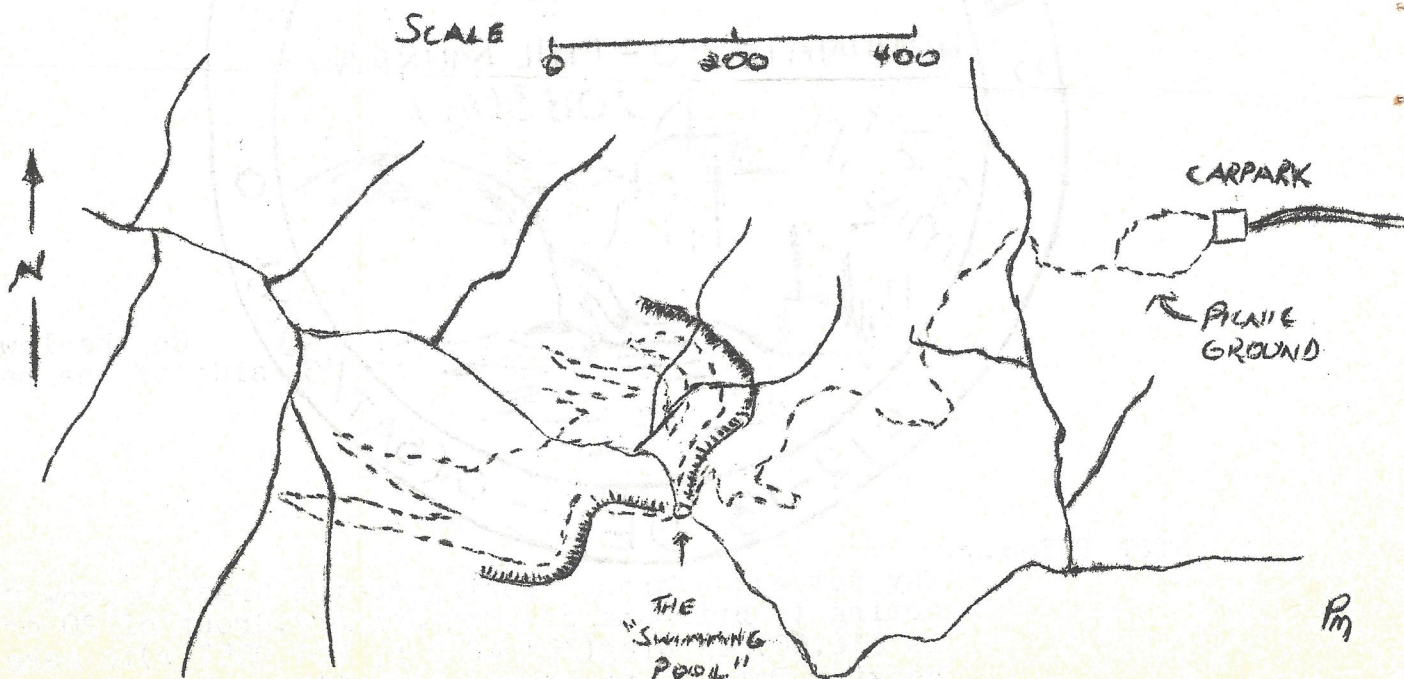

The Nightcap Range is in northern NSW about 60km south of the border. The range forms the southern rim of the Tweed Valley. See locality sketch. Distance is approximately 200km south of Brisbane, travelling time 4 hours. We will camp at the Forestry camping ground called Rummerg Park.

The first day we will walk out to the escarpment. An interesting point on the way is the Peach Mountain Lookout which provides views over Lismore. The route follows the old Nightcap Track which was the original route between Murwillumbah and Lismore which took 3 days on pack horse.

The 'Tea Tree' Lookout on the escarpment will give views across to Mount Warning and the MacPherson ranges and over to Daughboy Mtn, Jerusalem Mtn and Mount Matheson.

If time permits we may be able to walk around to Mount Matheson and down to Turntable Falls before returning.

On Sunday we will walk down to Miryon Falls (100 metres high) and Quondong Falls. A round trips of about 8km.

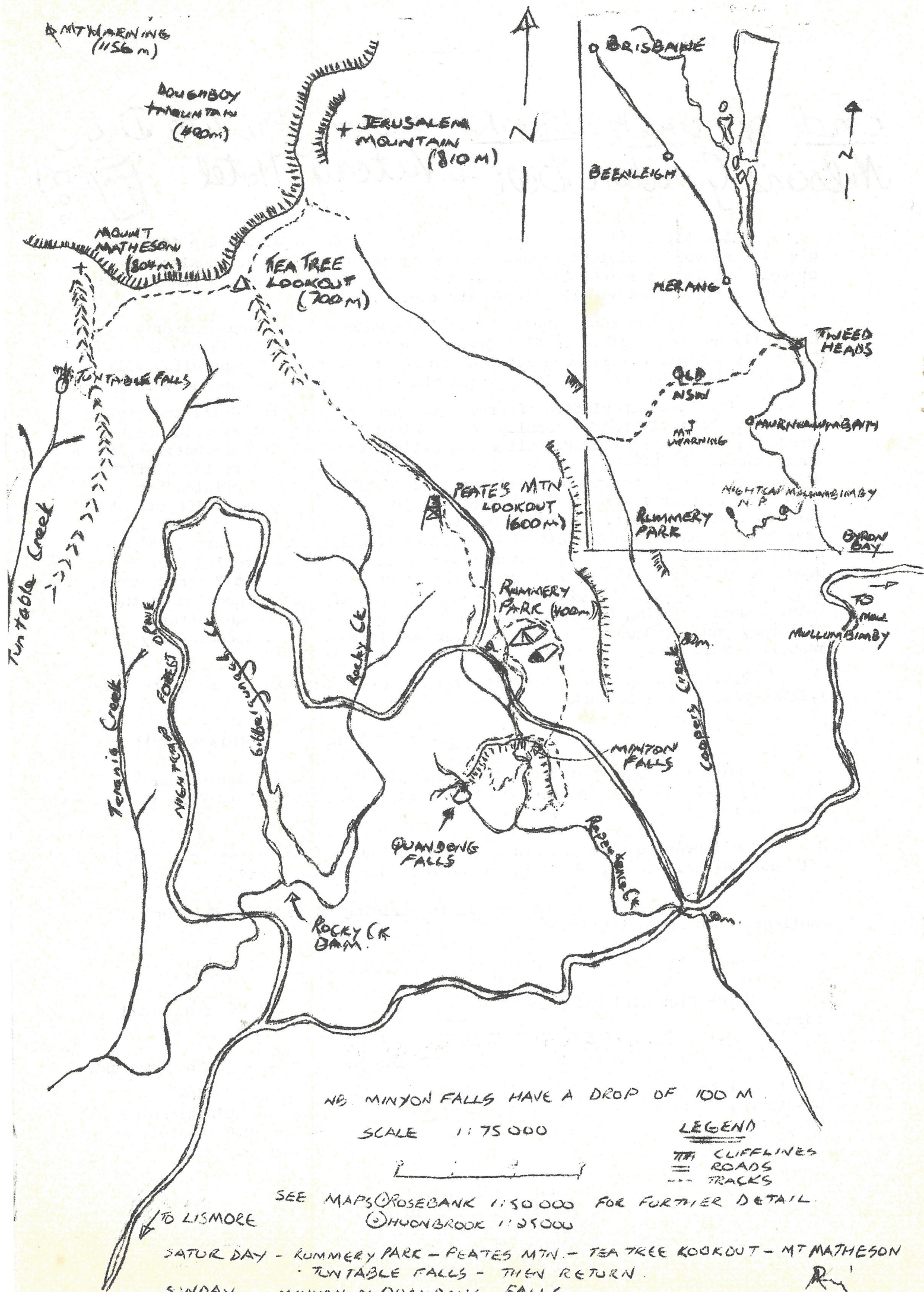

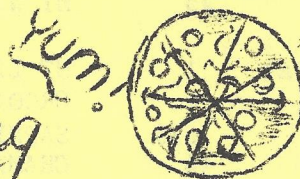
