CICADA !

Whether you spent your New Year at O'Reilly's or at home you would surely have heard some of our cicada species - green mondays or double drummers. They make normal conversation impossible sometimes and your ears go on vibrating even after they've all abruptly stopped singing at precisely the same instant. Presumably the female green mondays don't find it intolerable.

In a good year the bare soil around trees and shrubs is pitted with large cicada holes. The first 'cri de Coeur' of the mating season is hard to miss. There's no faint tentative piping, no gradual increase in volume or rise in pitch to accustom the human

ear.

The nymphs surface from under the earth where they've been waiting for suitable weather conditions and crawl, wet with mud

from their tunnels, up the nearest tree-trunk.

Everyone knows what a cicada 'shell' looks like. The green monday nymph does not climb far up the tree for its moult. The hump-backed nymph rests its head upwards or hangs from a horizontal twig with its sharp claws fixed firmly into the bark. After a while a narrow slit opens down the centre of the thorax and shows the first hint

of emerald green underneath.


The split widens and continues upwards and the first part i of the cicada to emerge is the head. The wings appear incredibly small, crumpled appendages turned down against the sides of the orange-yellow abdomen. The cicada bends over backwards, and the first two pair of legs are pulled free. Soon its hanging by the tip of the abdomen and the hind legs, which are still fixed inside the old shell. When these legs are freed at last the insect bends upwards again and grasps the head of the old shell and pulls the tip of the abdomen free. The cicada clings motionless to the old shell for a while till the wings have finished expanding.

Then the insect crawls to the tops of the trees to the sun to begin its brief life. The birds make short work of the cicadas. Perhaps the mute fimales survive a little longer. Some of them live long enough to laytheir eggs along the gum tree branches and ensure
