PAST OUTING-PETER'S CREEK OVERNIGHTER 5/1/80

After attending the 6.30pm. Mass 13 walkers assembled outside the Cathredal for the first walk of 1980. Our party included three visitors: John Cashman, John Moran and Joseph Ebbage.

Promptly at 7.45pm. we headed off for Maleny arriving there at 9.30pm. After a short break we were off again, in convoy, to our campsite. The only incident to marr the journey was my missing the campsite. The mistake was quickly realised, however, on returning we found the site already occupied and we were forced to drive back up the road till we came to an alternative campsite. Here we erected tents in a slight drizzle. Under a large tarpaulin we were able to brew a billy of tea and have supper before retiring.

Next morning the rain was still coming down lightly as we walked down to the proper campsite and headed down the ridge to the Breadknife. The Breadknife is a large formation of rock riseng from the creek bed at the junction of the Booloomba and Bundaroo Creeks. It is a very interesting spot with good swimming holes and is well worth visiting on a fine day. We proceeded up Booloomba Greek and before long we were heading up Peter's Creek

Walking was slow as the rocks were slippery from the rain and the creek was up slightly. For some of the time it was much asier to walk through the water rather than bash through the rainforest, which grew right down to the water's edge.

We had planned to get back to the Breadknife by lunch time, so for expedience's sake we left our packs and lunch behind. By the end of the Peter's Creek section of the walk we realised that we would be having a late lunch.

Here we crossed over a ridge for the return leg. By this time everyone was well and truly soaked so walking through the creek up to waist depth was no obstacle to us.

The rainforest was very pretty and grew high up the slopes of the ridge which bordered the creek. The canopy was so thick, at times it completely prevented the rain passing through. At this point our party split up with the more energetic walkers streaking ahead. On returning to the Breadknife we all agreed to fore our swim in favour of some dry clothes, so despite not 'aving eaten since breakfast we headed straight back to the cars where we changed into dry clothing and enjoyed a well-earned lunch at about 4.00pm.

After lunch we packed up and drove back to Brisbane, arriving home safely by 8.00pm.

Dear people,


