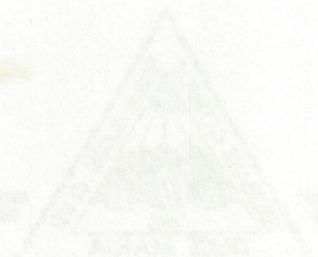

In the 19th Century Timber cutters logged Cedar and other valuable timber from the valleys of the Coomera, Tweed and other areas of S.E. Qld and north N.S.W. This walk will cover a section of the area logged for Cedar along the Coomera River.

Did You Know?

In spite of modern advances in medicine, leeches are still in use at that pinnacle of medical excellence, London's St. Bartholomew's Hospital. According to the pharmacy department, the leeches which cost about \$ 1.00 each and come from Hungary and France, are mainly used to reduce the swelling of black eyes and cauliflower ears. To eliminate the risk of infection, each leech is used only once but, with true British concern for animal welfare, the leeches are not destroyed. Instead, they are "put out to grass" in a special tank where they can survive for up to three years.
