### THINKING CATHOLIC:

### 'Jesus' choice wrong: expert'

"Nobody will admit to having composed a cynical piece of antibureaucratic prose being circulated around Melbourne by a group of Catholic priests.

Former Pentridge Prison chaplain Father John Brosnan, says it tickles the priests' fancy because it shows that "God's ways are not necessarily our ways".

At a Rotary dinner last week Father Brosnan evoked a mixed response when he read out the piece, which takes the form of a memo, directed to Jesus, Son of Joseph, by Jordan Management Consultants:
