The annual General Meeting has the power to accept or reject or call for modifications of any section of the Report. Reports have been amended in the past after publication.


Finally, I would like to remind you that the Annual Report is a record of your activities and you should ensure that it is accurate.

Girraween National Park is unique in Queensland, being the only extensive area of granite boulders, tors, and mountains in the state. The park lies about five miles off the New England highway just before Wallangarra, and about 160 miles from Brisbane. The highest point within the park is Mt. Norman 4,156 and a popular choice with bushwalkers. The outstanding feature of Mt. Norman is the formation on the northern end known as the Eye of the Needle.

Other features of this beautiful national park are the two Pyramids, huge rocky masses offering plenty of interesting rock scrambling. There are also river caves (if you can find them) and jumbled stacks of boulders with plenty of scope for exploration - with a torch.

NOTE: warm clothes may be useful since Wyberba can become quite cold at night even in May.

"Its the creek" said I "Woopee" said 14 "Yes, but its down a 60ft cliff" said I "Groan" said 14


Good bushwalkers never give up. 15 chopped down a tall tree, lowered it over the edge and proceeded to slide down, followed by packs.




