FOOD SECTION

Now that I have the attention of all the big garbage disposal units in the club, here is a popular recipe for home made Muesli. The recipe makes about 2½ lb. of muesli which should last the most avid G.D.U. a couple of trips.

Ingredients

½ lb rolled oats
½ lb wheat germ
¼ lb raw sugar (optional)
½ cup dried skimmed milk powder
2 oz. chopped dried apricots
2 oz. chopped dried apples
2 oz. raisins
2 oz. sultanas
2 oz. crushed nuts

Method Place all ingredients in a large bowl and mix well. Store in a sealed plastic bag in a cool place. Fresh or reconstituted milk can be used on a cupful of this muesli for a nourishing breakfast meal.

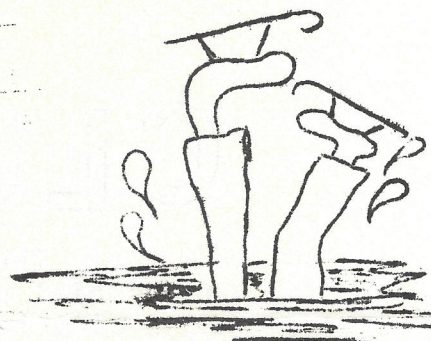
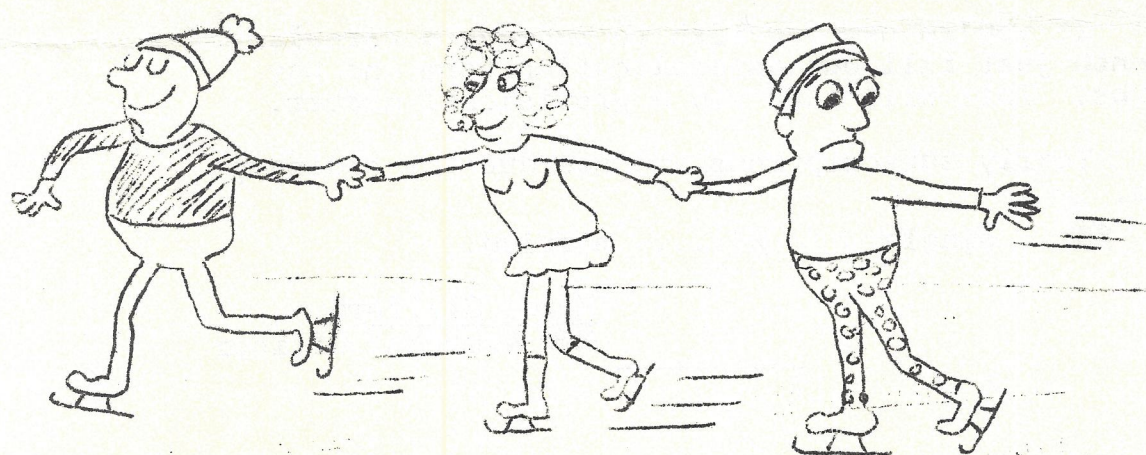
CLUB MASS
