Navigating is essentially map reading, which simply means identifying the ridges and gullies in the field as contour lines on the sap. The only way to gen good at map reading is to do it and orienteering is one of the best ways to do it.

The Queensland Orienteering Association are holding one of their regular orienteering days

and we are going along as members of the publica-

There are several courses starting with novice level, which are only a 1km circuit along some bush tracks up to A form advanced that are 6 to 7 Km long that involve bush-bashing.

Each course has several checkpoint, which are simply flags in the bush with a "punch" to mark your card to prove you have been there.

The idea of the day is to improve your map reading skill not to prove how fast you can run through the bush.

If you require transport to Fruitgrove, a Beenleigh train leaves Central Station at 8.05am and arrives at Fruitgrove at 8.36am.
