Yes folks, it's on again. The ever popular Colonial Ball. If you have been to one, you know the story (and will immediately see me at the next meeting and pay for your ticket).

For those new to the Club, this event is a dance set back in time at about the 1860's. Those present are the old colonial types:- soldiers, sailors, maids, sherherds, wenches, convicts, etc. As you may have gathered, the idea is to be dressed in colonial costume. The Moreton Bay Bush Band will again treat you to their rhythmic music, and call you around the dance floor. You will perform gentle bush dancing ie. colonial dancing.

The night is run along the lines of a 19th century subscription ball. Tickets are purchased in advance, and upon arrival you receive a dance card. For the first half hour, you ask around the hall for partners, a new partner for each of the sixteen dances.

Dances are either couples, sets of eight, lines of eight, or large circles. Some are progressive, with most you stay with your partner - though you get to dance with all of the opposite sex in your set. Even if you come with a partner, you will only dance with that person once or twice. So, even if you don't have a partner, you will still get plenty of dances. WARNING:- be on time, so you can 'pencil in' your partners, coming late usually means you might have to sit out some dances.

You don't need to know how to dance:- the ball committee hold regular practice nights prior to the ball. The dances are also 'called' on the night of the ball. The Club holds a simple pre-ball get together (mainly to share transport), and also a post-ball party, which usually continues into the wee hours.

Practices are on at 7pm, Wed 12th, 19th, & 26th June at the East Brisbane State School Hall, Wellington Rd (Cnr Stanley St) East Brisbane, and a Club practice on Sun 30th June at the Parish Hall, St Michael's Church, 250 Banks St Dorrington at 1pm.

Beau Brummel to Grass Tree Knob is part of the "Little Liverpool range" forming one side of the Laidley Valley. RULE AMENDMENTS

The following are proposed amendments to the rules. Due to the possible controversy surrounding one amendment, the details are presented here. The proposed amendments will be debated at the JULY Meeting.

Amendment 3 has been presented as a number of alternatives. The various proposals will be considered in a similar fashion to amendments to motions (debate will be to choose the most acceptable of the 4 proposals, the chosen proposal will then be debated).

It is proposed that debate on the amendments will be conducted along similar lines to that used last year for the adoption of the new Rules:-

Speaker in favour (Mover?) - 3 minutes.
Speaker against - 3 minutes.
Speaker in favour (Seconder?) - 3 minutes.
Speaker against - 3 minutes.
Etc.

There will be a time limit of around 45 minutes for debate, including the Movers right of reply of 2 mins. Should the debate becomes repetitive or too heated, the debate may be closed. An equal number of speakers will be maintained on each side, with the Mover and Seconder always having the right to speak.

Debate will be restricted to the matter under discussion, personal attacks, in any form, will not be tolerated. Each speaker is requested to introduce new material, not merely repeat what others have said.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 1. - MEMBERSHIP CHANGE-OVER

DELETE

07.01 Every person who at the date of incorporation of the Association was a member of the unincorporated association and who on or before the day of incorporation agrees in writing to become a member of the association shall be admitted by the Management Committee to the same class of membership of the Association as that member held in the unincorporated association, and shall not be required to pay any further subscription until the next due date for payment of that subscription.

REPLACE WITH

07.01 Every person who at the date of incorporation of the Association was a member of the unincorporated association and has not notified the Management Committee in writing on or before the day of incorporation that they do not wish to be a member of the incorporated association shall be admitted by the Management Committee to the same class of membership of the Association as that member held in the unincorporated association, and shall not be required to pay any further subscription until the next due date for payment of that subscription.

OR REPLACE WITH

07.01 Every person who at the date of incorporation of the Association was a member of the unincorporated association shall be admitted by the Management Committee to the same class of membership of the Association as that member held in the unincorporated association, and shall not be required to pay any further subscription until the next due date for payment of that subscription.

RULE AMENDMENTS (cont)**PROPOSED AMENDMENT 2. - PETTY CASH****DELETE**

29.04 All amounts of twenty dollars or over shall be paid by cheque signed by any two of the president, secretary, treasurer or other member authorised from time to time by the Management Committee.

REPLACE WITH

29.04 All amounts of or over that specified by Regulation 19(d) of the Association Incorporation Regulations as amended from time to time shall be paid by cheque signed by any two of the President, Secretary, Treasurer or other member authorised from time to time by the Management Committee.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 3. - ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

Current Position. Associate Membership is for Non-Catholics only. Associate Members cannot vote or be members of the Management Committee.

Proposal 1. Removes all reference to Associate Membership and Catholic requirement. Same Membership fee for all.

Proposal 2. Retains reference to Associate Membership and Catholic requirement. Associate Members have same rights as Ordinary Members. Same Membership fee for all.

Proposal 3. Retains reference to Associate Membership and Catholic requirement. Associate Members have same rights as Ordinary Members except that they are ineligible for membership of Management Committee.

Proposal 4. Retains reference to Associate Membership and Catholic requirement. Associate Members have same rights as Ordinary Members except that they are ineligible for membership of some (majority of) Management Committee Positions.

The existing rules are as follows (the amendments seek to delete these rules and replace them with the new sections given):-

06.01.01 Ordinary Members - Ordinary Membership shall be open to any individuals of the Catholic Faith over the age of 18 years. Ordinary Members in these Rules shall be called "members".

06.01.02 Associate Members - Associate Membership shall be open to any individuals not of the Catholic Faith over the age of 18 years. Associate Members shall be entitled to exercise all of the privileges pertaining an Ordinary Member with the following exceptions.

06.01.02.01 Associate members shall not be entitled to vote on any matter before any meeting of the Association.

06.01.02.02 Associate members shall not be eligible for nomination or election to any position on the Management committee.

PROPOSAL NO 1.**REPLACE WITH**

06.01.01 Ordinary Members - Ordinary Membership shall be open to any individuals over the age of 18 years. Ordinary Members in these Rules shall be called "members".

AND RENUMBER SECTIONS AS APPROPRIATE
