One of the better hills close to Brisbane, very visible from Ipswich actually. The trip offers good views of other regular club trips - Knapps Peak, Mt. Joyce, Maroon, Greville and Walker. The party will follow a road into the base, then go up a gradual slope and finally weave its way along to the top. Only $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of water which can be picked up at the bottom.

Trip leaves from corner Roma & Turbot Sts. on Friday at 7.30 p.m. promptly.

The basecamp will be on Christmas Creek. One day will be spent going to Westray's Grave. Camp will be made by the creek near the Campbell farmhouse. From there we walk a couple of miles along an excellent dirt road with many creek crossings, often deep. At the end of the road the rain forest begins. A wide track has been cut through the forest. Fun spot is the log which must be hurdled. There is a lot of mud and water to walk through so no weak hearts please! On the way through the rain forest there are some beautiful patches of country such as the indicator about 40 minutes from the grave, country which makes the whole trip worthwhile. Due to the action of treasure hunters the Stinson wreck has disappeared and has been deleted. On the way to Westray's grave magnificent views can be obtained of the majestic Buchanan's Fort which is the target for the second day.

After climbing three rises one reaches the top of Buchanan's Fort from which expansive views of the surrounding countryside may be obtained. If you admire sunsets, observe the sunset on Mt. Widgee, the shadows, light and dark patches and the haze.

Throughwalk - this walk will be led by Paul Wijngaarden a club member now residing in Sydney. This should prove to be the best run trip of the season. Paul will catch the Scenic Tours bus - leaving the Greyhound terminal at 6.15 p.m. and costing \$3.50, which will be deducted from the \$6.00 trip cost. The route will be the border track O'Reillys - Echo Point, Point Lookout - Stinson Wreck - Christmas Creek. The club has not done a Throughwalk for some years along this stretch of the border therefore this is an excellent opportunity to see the rabbit fence.
