Seven brave souls and true camped near the Boonah border gate on Friday night after a contracted journey. We left Brisbane half an hour late and arranged to meet at Cathy McHugh's house at Ipswich. One car arrived and we waited for Geof's Car. After watching most of the "King and I" and drinking coffee, Geof's car eventual arrived. Justin had.directed them to Calamvale before realising that they didn't want to be there and later they stopped to help two Bavarians with car trouble! Considering the shops are closed at Boonah on Friday nights, McHugh's house mads an excellent substitute. Thank You.

A fine cool morning dawned and after breakfast we headed on foot towards Wilson's Peak. Ascending this mountain proved much easier in the dry than on the wet pre-outing. Although the top of the mountain is bushy, excellent views were afforded from different vantage points due to the clear atmosphere:

The campsite overlooked the headwaters of the Condamine with good views of Superbus and Wilson's Peak. The cold night was kept at bay by a campfire and good food. Barney and Justin were at their insulting best and ragged everything from Tony's toothbrush to Geof's legs.
