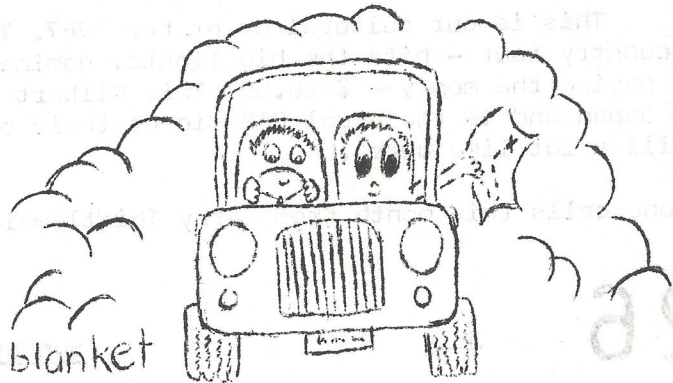

PROSPECTING NOTES

Glen Innes at the Heart of the Tablelands is well known for its abundance of gems and minerals. An amazing diversity of gems and minerals have been discovered and mined in the district, including, on the mineral side, bauxite, arsenic, bismuth, cobalt, lead, manganese, molybdenum, silver, tin and wolfrum. Gemstones found in the district include quartz, topaz, zircon emeralds and of course, sapphires.

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Throughout the district there are a number of areas on Crown Land and private property that have been set aside for those wishing to fossick. A fossicking licence is required for those wishing to fossick in New South Wales, and these are available from Cheshire's Total Service Station on the New England Highway and the Court House in Grey Street. For those beginning to fossick, following are a few basic directions on fossicking for gemstones. Do not be disheartened if you don't find a cutter, our Commercial Mines have to do a lot of digging with mechanical equipment before they find stones they can cut. However, keep trying, fossicking is fun, and you just never know, today might be your lucky day.

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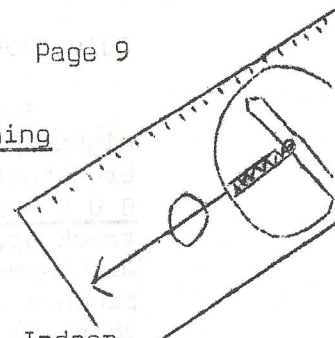

"A walk on the wet side"

With mist hugging the range and the moon struggling to breakthrough the cloud, it looked as though we would be in for a "wet one" on that Friday night. Nevertheless it was packs up, as we walked in to Grace's Hut along the track from the Mt. May Water Reserve. It was a great chance to unwind on that dark night, arriving at the camp at midnight.

A fairly early start saw us climb the long ridge to Montserrat Lookout, to loosen cramped muscles. But the view was mist (missed). We now entered rainforest, a constant companion as we walked to a nearby knoll. Time for compass bearings. Heading down a westerly ridge we struck a large patch of old eucalypt forest surrounded by rainforest. An interesting sight.

We climbed towards a dark shape hidden by cloud. After a sharp pinch we stood on Focal Peak, whose name relates to the volcanic activity which formed this mountainous area. Smoko! Out comes a bag of scroggin provided by Paul. Spirits revived.

At over 1000 metres we were in the cloud, and the cold didn't encourage long rests. Heading for Cedar Pass we encountered large cedar trees amongst others. Mt. Ballow is an area that has not been logged. Striking for the Mt. Ballow range we entered temperate rainforest. This is characterised by beautiful Antarctic Beech trees (*Nothofagus neorei*) with their bulbous bases, gnarled and twisted branches - they are antiquity itself. There is less diversity of tree species here.

On the Ballow Range we visited Mowburra Peak which is covered in *Leptospermums* and *accacas*. After lunch at Durrumlee Peak, eaten standing up we continued for Double Peak. First Peak no worries. Second Peak a little exposed, quite cool. To descend there was a rock face treacherous in the high wind and rain. Using ropes we got down. We decided to stop in the saddle between Double Peak and Junction, as it provided more cover from the weather.

After a cosy night (3 to a tent) we struck for Junction Peak, highest point on the range. Beech forest in cloud provides tremendous atmosphere. At a knoll we dropped packs to venture to Nothofagus Mountain. Tim produced chocolate, and John, pistachio nuts.

On an easterly bearing we descended to Big Lonely. On route we encountered large buttressed trees, walking stick palms and cedar. Finally on Big Lonely at midday, we knew it would be all downhill. By this stage, the weather had determined our assault on Mt. Barney was postponed to another day. We had climbed all the peaks of Ballow bar one. Now followed a long easterly ridge to Ballow Creek.

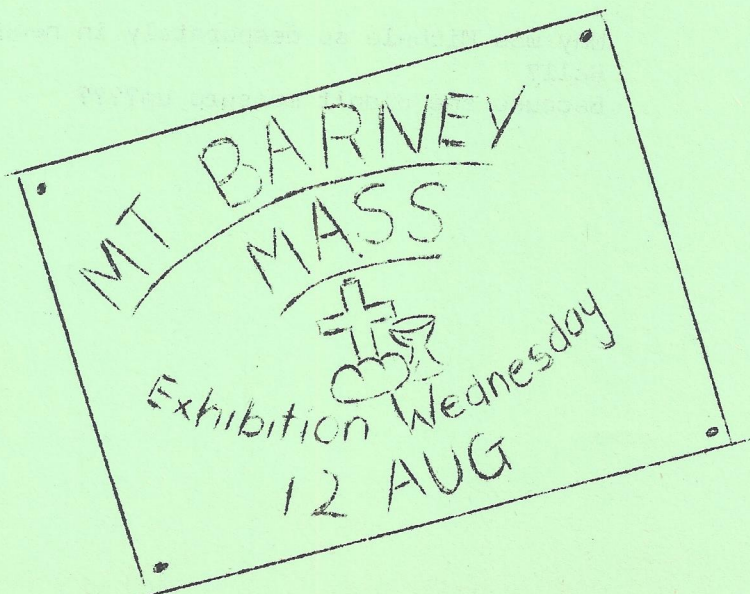
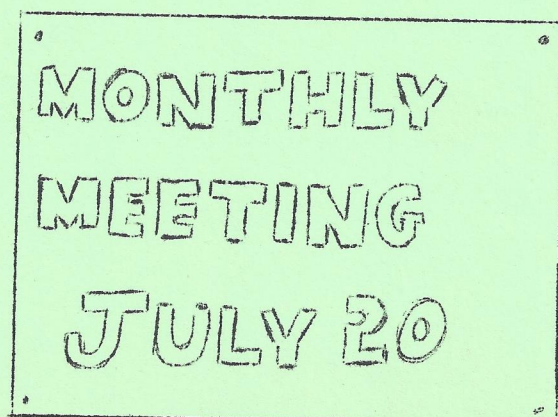
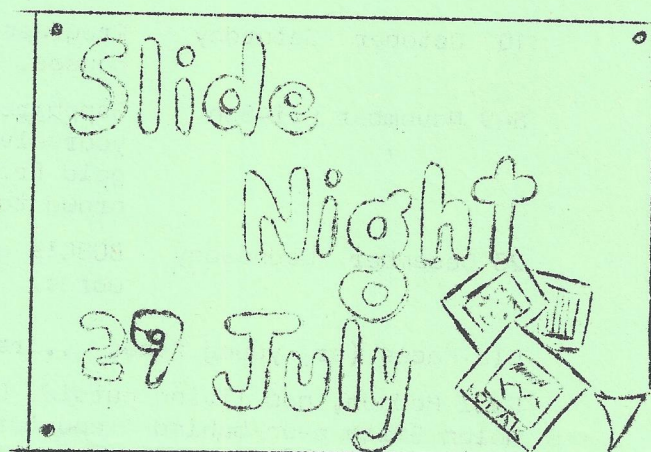
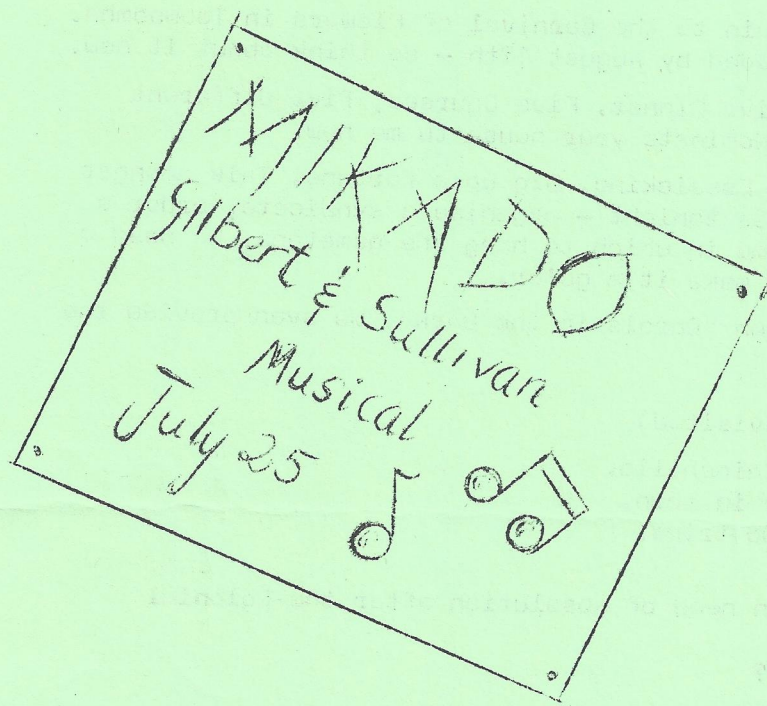
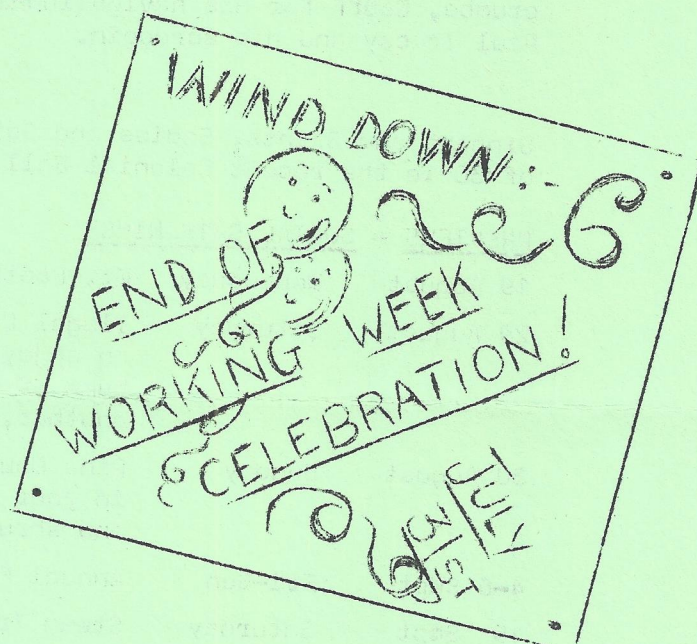
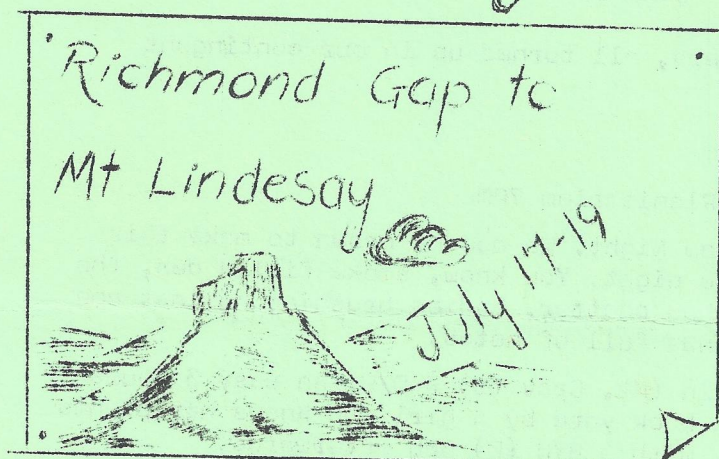
At a rocky knoll we emerged to the best view of the walk, revealing the peaks of Ballow and parts of Barney. Photos were taken. Shortly we were in eucalypt forest with impressive stringybarks and numerous crows nest and elkhorn ferns. Here lunch was enjoyed with a billy. Of course light rain fell.

After a leisurely lunch it was downhill to Ballow Creek, a most beautiful creek untouched by man and no weeds. We walked by rapids, deep pools, picabeen palm groves in the rain. Shortly we reached Barney Creek and a race to reach the Upper Portals track before dark. In the evening gloom we contoured the slopes into Yamhara Creek and to the track. Then followed a hours walk to Grace's Hut.

It was decided that half would walk out, the remainder to follow next morning. All reached the vehicles safely. An end to a satisfying walk. The

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atmosphere of a rainforest is best captured on a cold, wet, windy walk. 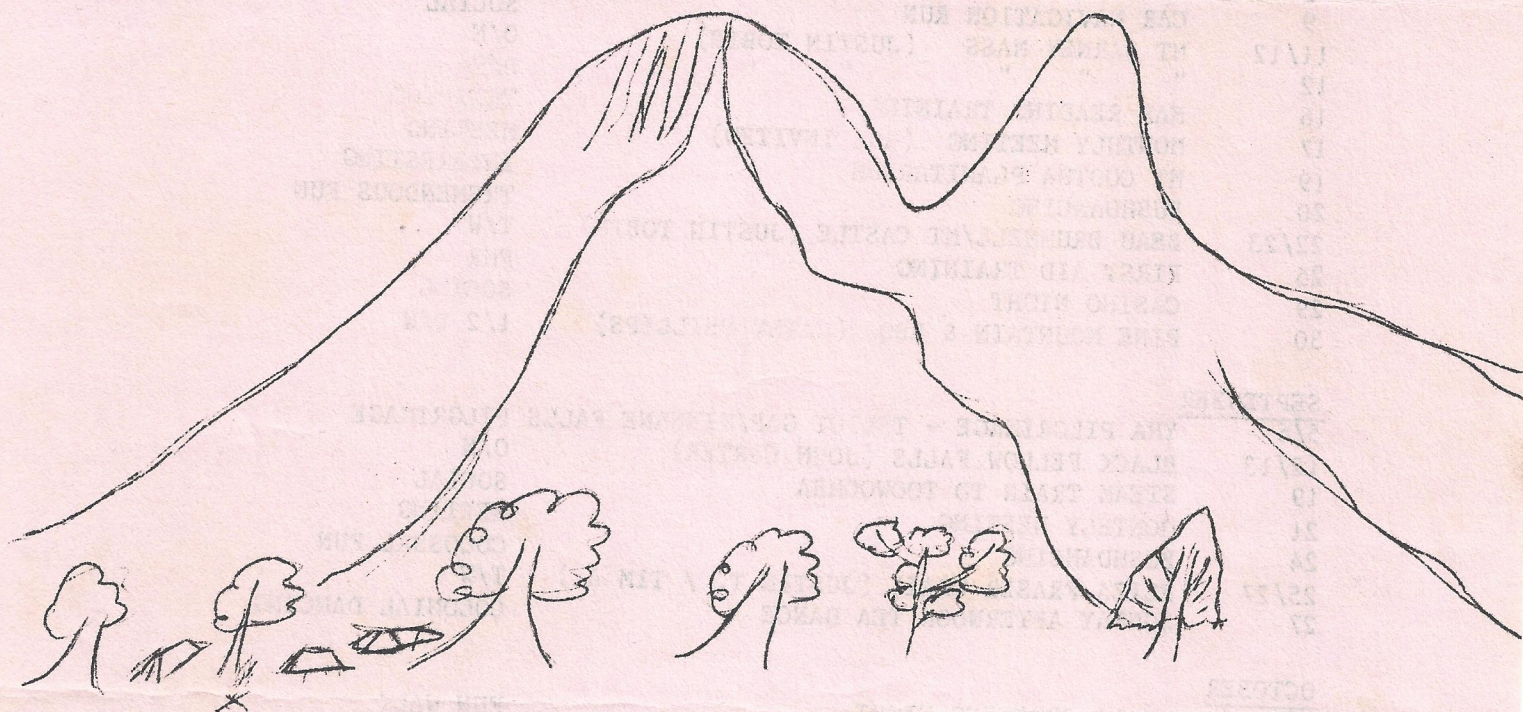
