## FOOD SECTION

### SWEET AND SOUR RICE

An excellent way of using up your trip left overs.

#### Ingredients-

- 1 cup of rice
- 1 carrot chopped in small pieces
- 1 onion chopped in small pieces
- a few beans sliced thinly (or peas)
- pineapple pieces, 1 egg
- add leftover meat (cooked) or bacon.
- butter or margarine

#### Method-

Cook rice-boil carrots and beans or peas until nearly soft. Fry onion in some butter and put aside. Melt butter in pan and fry rice for a few minutes. Add onion, meat chopped into small pieces, vegetables and pineapple pieces. Stir until all are heated through. Add beaten egg last of all and cook for a few minutes stirring all the time.



BIRD OF THE MONTH  
Wedge-Tailed Eagle (Eaglehawk)  
*Aquila audax*

This eagle with its golden brown neck and dark brown feathers can be seen throughout Australia. The eagle has a length of 1 metre with a tail length of 42 cm.

A scream may be heard when the eagle attacks, but at other times a relatively weak, shrill two note call is made. Food usually consists of rabbits, young dingoes, possums, galahs and other birds. Also included in the diet is dead sheep and kangaroos as carrion.

The wedge shaped tail is a means of identifying this eagle from others. The wing span may extend to 3 m but is usually about 2.5 m. The nesting season is from June to November when one or two eggs are laid.

Weighing up to 5 kgs, this eagle is the most majestic of Australia's birds of prey and one of the largest eagles in the world. If you want to see one while walking, you should look for a high soaring eagle gliding through the air.

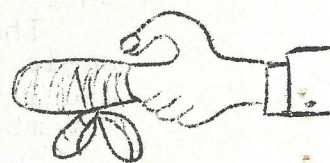

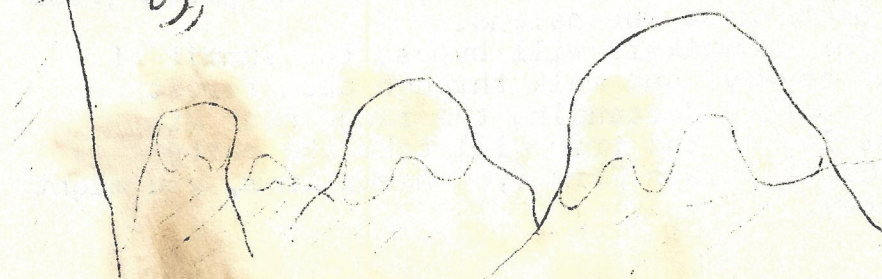

EQUIPMENT HIRE SECTION

As you may have realised by now, Brisbane is rather lacking in shops which stock quality bushwalking equipment. This is especially the case when it comes to variety and equipment made for very cold conditions. Sydney and Melbourne have a good variety of shops in this field.

If you choose to buy in Sydney or Melbourne you will have to use mail order facilities or make a special trip. Obviously mail order is much more convenient if wisely used. When ordering by mail, please describe the goods as fully as possible and don't forget sizes and colours. Indicate a second preference if possible. Payment is usually required with the order so make sure your cheque or postal order goes in the envelope. Specify the freight arrangements. Parcel post is the cheapest and does not take too long. Special arrangements such as air freight can be arranged provided pre-payment is made.
